The Holy Transfiguration of our Lord, Jesus Christ (Aug. 19):

Transfiguration commemorates the transfiguration or metamorphosis of Christ on Mount Tabor, when our Lord appeared in his divine glory before the Apostles Peter, James, and John. The event of the Transfiguration is recorded in three of the four Gospels: Matthew 17:1-9, Mark 9:2-8, and Luke 9:28-36.

Jesus took the Apostles Peter, James, and John with Him to the top of a mountain, and while there, Jesus was transfigured. His face shone like the sun, and His garments became glistening white. Moses and Elijah appeared with Christ, talking to Him.

Peter declared how good it was for them to be there and expressed the desire to build three tabernacles for Moses, Elijah, and Christ.

While Peter was speaking, a bright cloud overshadowed them. A voice came from the cloud saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased. Listen to Him."

When the disciples heard this, they fell on their faces, filled with awe.

Jesus came to them and told them not to be frightened.

When the three looked up they saw only Jesus.

As Jesus and His disciples came down the mountain, He told them not to speak of what they had seen until He had risen from the dead.

Covid-19 Church Reopening (GREEN)
Church is open under Green rules. Special precautions are being taken; entry and exit through main doors only, **side door from the ramp will be locked**, masks will be required, hand sanitizing will be required, gloves will be available, parishioners must sign - in, everyone's temperature will be checked, seating will be spaced apart (families may sit together), veneration of Holy objects will be performed by bowing and making the sign of the cross (no kissing), there will be no grouped choir, **paper bulletins will be available on the Tetrapod for you to pick up**, the collection basket will be placed on the Tetrapod for donations, children under 10 are not to receive Communion, the church hall is closed, no coffee hour after Liturgy, and confessions will be taken by appointment on Saturdays (only one person in church at a time). The church will be thoroughly disinfected between services.
