

## Saint Andrew the Apostle



We celebrate the memory of St. Andrew, the first to be called by Jesus Christ to be an Apostle. It happened like this: Soon after the Lord's baptism by John in the Jordan, John stood on the banks with two of his disciples, John and Andrew; and when he saw Jesus coming, he said, Behold the Lamb of God. Hearing these words from him, both disciples followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them walking, He said to them, what do you need? They said to Him, "Rabbi, where do you live?" The Lord answered, "Come, and see." They went and saw where He lived and stayed with Him that day. One of these two who heard about Jesus from John was Andrew, the brother of Peter. He first found his brother Peter and said to him, "We have found the Messiah," which means, Christ, and led him to Jesus. Staying with Christ for one day and hearing from Him the words of Divine wisdom and the economy of our salvation, the Apostle Andrew left everything he had in the world—house, family, fishing, and his entire meager fortune, and became a man with no possessions, acquiring the most *precious*, irreplaceable and eternal treasure—faith in Christ—following Him zealously, without turning back, until the end of his life.
