3. Go. We are in the planning stages now. We will be taking a team this fall (hopefully mid November) to the Sulphur area to do what they need the most at that time.



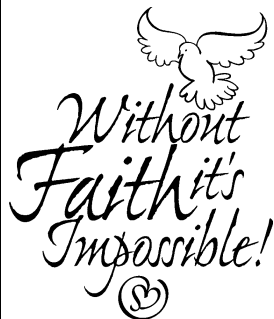
