Broome Therapy Dogs (“BTD”) Workplace Giving Partnership Executive Summary

Purpose

Broome Therapy Dogs (BTD) invites employers to participate in a **simple, voluntary workplace giving program** that enables staff to support free therapy dog services and four locally based Broome charities through pre-tax payroll giving.

The program is designed to be **low-administration, compliant with Australian payroll and ATO guidance**, and flexible to suit organisations of all sizes.

What is Workplace Giving?

Workplace giving allows employees to make regular donations to registered charities directly through payroll. Generally donations are deducted **pre-tax**, and employees receive the tax benefit immediately via reduced PAYG withholding.

Why Employers Participate

- ✓ Builds meaningful local community connection
- ✓ Minimal ongoing administration once established

Optional **employer co-contribution (matched giving)** further amplifies impact and reinforces shared values.
