Gardening Program

Whenever anyone complains about the weather, a friend of mine says, "But spring is coming!" That's the way it is at JAM. Spring is coming and we need to get our seeds and donations collected so that we will be able to help gardeners in 18 counties of southeastern Ohio grow their own food. In March we will have seed potatoes and baking potatoes (through the Society of St. Andrew) to give away. Then in mid-May we will distribute seeds and tomato plants to the 29 agencies we work with. It takes a lot of preparation and coordination of dates and places, but thousands of people can have vegetables to eat, to share, and to preserve.

Some of our gardeners use flower beds and trellises at their rented homes or apartments. Others put their vegetables seeds into whatever large containers are available. Some of the seeds are used in community gardens where several people help with the planting, caring, and harvesting so that food can be shared. Here in Jackson, we maintain a tomato patch behind the local Food Pantry and clients are given the "fruit" of our labors.

You have an opportunity to help. Cash donations are needed to buy the tomato plants and to help with transportation costs of the potatoes. Seeds are needed—everything from herbs to squash. Seeds need to be hardy in Zone 6 and have a relatively short growing season. Our gardening program is expanding each year. Last year we nearly depleted all seeds that were donated. This year we expect more needy families to reach out to JAM, as word is spreading about this wonderful ministry. Early donations, and all seed and monetary donations are greatly appreciated.

If you send your donation through the USPS, please use **P.O. Box 603, Jackson, OH 45640.** If you ship seeds to us through UPS or FedEx, you will need our street address, 119 McKitterick Ave., Jackson, Ohio 45640. If you would like to deliver your seeds in person, please call ahead

(740-286-1320). One of the JAM staff would be happy to give you a tour, answer questions, or give you an opportunity to help sort and package. If you are just passing by, you may leave your seeds in the big yellow box that will be in front of our office.

Thank you for helping us help others. Deadline to send your seeds is **April 15th**.



The stores have already begun to put out their vegetable seed packets. So, you can get a head start in purchasing them.



Summer Work Camp— Can Be a "Life Changer"----Even

though it's only January, it's not too early to start making plans to attend a Summer Work Camp with Jackson Area Ministries. Sowing Seeds & Serving Others--Last year in March, two truckloads of seed potatoes and baking potatoes came to Jackson Area Ministries from our longstanding partner Society of St. Andrew. In a few hours, teams of volunteers unloaded, repacked, and sent those seed potatoes out again to nearly 20 different agencies and organization across Southern Ohio.

Amidst the larger group, one recipient stood out---Gannon. He is only 11 years old and from a small neighborhood, on the outskirts of town but he has a heart as big as the potato bags he was carrying.

Using the ample space in his grandfather's backyard and the humble tools available, Gannon transforms a small amount of seed potatoes into a large blessing. This is Gannon's fourth season of planting and sharing potatoes! He is a living testimony to the old sayings: "age is only a number" and "anything is possible if you put your mind to it".

He regularly spends time serving his neighbors—mowing lawns, cleaning up messes, and generally helping when he finds an opportunity.

At 11 years old, Gannon can dispatch fallen trees, drive a tractor, till the soil, prep seed potatoes. He's an amazing young boy. Here's a few pictures of his seed potatoes from planting to harvest.
