GARDENING 2024

Our seed sorting season began in mid-February as we prepared tables and totes in anticipation of donations of seed packets. We were not disappointed. Some days we added hundreds of packets of carrot seeds to their tote and other days cucumbers were the most profuse. When we thought we were not getting enough herbs, the next box we opened would have an abundance of parsley and sage. Some days we spent hours repackaging 50-pound bags of green beans into more family friendly portions.




In mid-March a truckload of potatoes arrived from the Society of St. Andrew. We do not have a loading dock at the JAM office so

the potatoes are delivered to Community Food Initiatives in Nelsonville. Agencies from the counties we serve collect their allotment at the CFI warehouse. Approximately two-thirds of the potatoes were for food; the rest of them were seed potatoes.

JAM ordered 600 flats of tomatoes—21,600 plants. Some were picked up at the greenhouse by the agencies that

requested them; the rest were brought to our office to be distributed. We had over 200 flats loaded in a 20-foot U-Haul truck plus at least 20 flats in the back of an SUV. Our supplier is in Racine, on the Ohio River, about 50 miles east of Jackson. We also have a retired pastor with a greenhouse who brings several dozen





Nauvoo Methodist Church in Scioto County is our largest recipient of seeds and plants—enough for 400 gardens. The volunteer coordinator works with 10 different agencies representing 7 different denominations. Most of the food pantries in the county are church sponsored. Our smallest agency is



Jackson Municipal Court that gets enough seeds and plants for one family-sized garden. Also, we have about a dozen tomato plants growing in two raised beds behind our local food pantry.

This year we have been blessed with sufficient monetary donations to cover staff expenses, truck rental, and the cost of tomato plants. Our plan is to visit some of the gardens and share pictures and stories on our website throughout the season. Keep watching your donations grow!

When she was able to return home after surgery and rehab the ramp was such a help for her to be able to get in and out of her home. Please remember this lady in your prayers as she has started her radiation and chemo treatments.

The week of June 9, 2024 was a very busy week for Jackson Area Ministries. This year was a little different for JAM. We had Youth/Adult workers from 3 churches here the same week. There were 8 worksites, with 7 ramps and 2 porch repairs/reconstructions. In addition one team helped finish a home by hanging drywall. One group even helped a neighbor clean out her flower bed. Everyone worked hard and we were blessed with great weather and no rain for the week. All these groups were being the hands and feet of Jesus and sharing God's love with the

homeowners.
