#### SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME.

"Where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" Today's gospel (and the gospels of the next 4 weekends) is about the announcement of the Eucharist, the Bread of Life. Immediately after the reading of this sixth chapter of the gospel of John that we will be reading, Jesus declares: "I am the Living Bread that comes down from heaven. Whoever eats this bread will live forever ". Today's gospel is about the multiplication of loaves, in order to feed more than 5,000 people. Let us focus our attention on the little boy in the gospel, the one who gave his five loaves and two fish. This boy could have kept his five loaves for himself or for him and his friends, but he gave them to Christ who in turn multiplies them (remember the wedding feast of Cana in Galilee, water into wine, Christ always uses what we have). This young boy in the gospel is you, is me, is every Christian, who, when facing the immensity of sufferings around us, think that we are not capable of doing something. Wrong. Generosity begets generosity, sharing begets more sharing, and love begets and creates more love. We don't lose when we give. We multiply when we share.
