THE TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In last Sunday's gospel, Jesus said: "some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last". In today's gospel, He says: "My friends, move up to a higher position..... For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." Last Sunday's gospel and the one of this Sunday have the same message. To be humbled here means to wash someone's feet (Last Supper) and to be exalted means to be lifted up on the cross (Good Friday leading to Easter Sunday). That is what we do every time we gather for Mass. That is what every single Parish does. We gather, not only among friends, but a gathering opened to all. Mass is a lowering of oneself (humble) that lifts us up (exalted). With today's gospel (and last Sunday's gospel too), Jesus is telling us how God functions. Our human norm, rule, habit is "I give you so that you give me in return...or I honor you so that you honor me in return". Jesus' world is a world of graciousness, God's graciousness, that means free of charge, complimentary.
