#### THE EXULTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS

In the days of old, before the celebration of the Feast of the Exaltation also called Holy Cross, there were 3 days called Ember Days (Thursday, Friday, and Saturday) which were the days to give thanks to God for the first fruits of the harvest. According to the Ordo (All sacristies in the world have an Ordo, which is the book that gives specific instructions of the liturgical celebration of each day of the year by giving the color of the vestments to wear, the degree of each celebration - that is Solemnity, Feast, Memorial of Obligation, etc...- the readings of the day, the prayers of the Breviary...) this Feast of The Exaltation of The Holy Cross celebrates a double anniversary: In Jerusalem, Constantine the emperor and new convert to the Catholic Church erected a round church called the Anastasis (Greek word for Jesus's Resurrection) above the empty grave of Jesus and also a Basilica, the Martyrium (a church to venerate martyrs). In between the two churches, he built a shrine, Calvarium, marking the place of The Crucifixion. They were dedicated in the year 335, and they were destroyed by the Persians in the year 614. The two churches (above mentioned) were rebuilt by Patriarch Modestus of Jerusalem in the year 626. Then they were destroyed again, this time by the Muslims in the year 1009. The present church of The Holy Sepulcher rebuilt by the Crusaders, was dedicated in the year 1149. This feast day also commemorates the discovery of the Lord's Cross by Saint Helena (the mother of the emperor Constantine) in the year 320.
