Then, for whatever happens, use the occasion to proclaim His Good News, the announcement of God's love. This way that Jesus proposes is not an easy one, because to follow Christ means to go against the tide, to go against the flow or as one outlines to go against the norm. To announce peace in today's world, to announce that people after all are brothers and sisters, to preach a civilization of love in today's hatred, in today's racism, is neither comfortable nor believable. It's precisely this paradoxical choice that Jesus is asking from us. For us Christians, we have to show God's love and the service of our neighbors to all.
