Easter is the most important solemnity in our Church: "If Christ didn't rise from the dead, vain is our faith " (1 Cor 15,14). We celebrate Easter in 50 days, with an Octave. It's the conclusion of the celebrations of the Holy Week. The perfect opportunity of the renewal of our baptismal promises. It's the fulfillment of God's promise to His people. Christ manifested Himself for 40 days after His Resurrection.

A-The gospels:

In Matthew (28,1-9): Mary Magdalene and the other women went to the tomb and met Him, asking them to tell His Disciples to go to Gallilee where they will meet Him.

In Mark (16,1-9): Mary, mother of James, and Salome, going to the tomb to anoint Him with burial ointments, saw a young man in white (an Angel), who announced to them that He is risen.

In Luke (24,1-9, and 24,13-33): Early in the morning, some holy women went to the tomb, and saw (terrified) an Angel who asked them: "Why are you looking for The Living One among the dead?"

Then, in the evening, with the Disciples of Emmaus (masterpiece of the Gospel).

In John (20,1-24): Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and was commissioned by Jesus to Peter and John, becoming thus the Apostle of the Apostles.

Then 8 days later, by the lakeside.

B- Brief history of the dates of Easter:

In the beginning and until the 2nd Century, Easter was celebrated near the date of the Jewish feast of Passover in order to replace it and MOSTLY to make a transition. Thus, the theology of the 8th Day (Sunday). Then came the Council of Nicea where it was decided that Easter coincides with springtime (between March 22 and April 23). Pope Gregory XIII in 1582 decreed that a new calendar be used (people went to bed on October 5th and woke up the next day on October 15th). This caused a friction with Orthodox Churches, who celebrate Easter 11 days apart. The 2d Vatican Council suggested to have a fixed date (with the condition of working with Orthodox Churches on this).
