The gospel today just like the gospel of every day, always gives us an opportunity to talk about many subjects. With today's gospel, we can talk about glory, God's glory. Or we can meditate about our own glory, because "the glory of God as St. Ireneus puts it, is a man fully alive". We can also meditate on the Commandment of love as Jesus says in today's gospel: "love one another", which is the condition to be His disciple. Another point we can meditate upon is a name mentioned in today's gospel; it's Judas. When we say Judas, what comes into your mind? What do you make of Judas? Can you take a few minutes to talk to yourself about Judas? No matter what you might say or not say about him, have you ever taken time to think that he was chosen by Jesus? Why? Jesus doesn't make a mistake; Jesus never makes a mistake. Why did Jesus choose Judas to be one of His disciples? Besides the fact that it is with love and out of love that Jesus chose Judas, this question of Judas choice by Jesus also delves deeply into the mystery of God. In the bulletins of the past, we always meditate or talk about a subject, but today, we suggest that you take time to talk about Judas as far as your mind can lead you.
