CORPUS CHRISTI - SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST

This solemnity is celebrated on the 2nd Sunday after Pentecost. It is a call to deepen our love and understanding of the presence of Our Lord Jesus Christ in the sacrament of the Eucharist. This Feast was instituted in the Middle Ages. Pope Urban the 4th in 1264 made this Feast mandatory for the Universal Church, but many theologians and bishops were very much opposed to it. But in Spain and part of Germany, it became very popular. But it was suppressed in nations that were predominantly protestants. Pope John the 22nd in 1318 ordered that The Blessed Sacrament be carried in procession on this day into the streets to bless the streets and the town. It's at this time that the monstrance was invented. The Council of Trent approved this procession as a public profession of our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. In Italy. Spain and part of Germany, the procession in the streets with the Blessed Sacrament is still very popular. In Lourdes, from April to September, the procession with The Blessed Sacrament is still practiced, and up to 17,000 people are part of this tradition daily. A final word to those who say that Jesus' presence in the Eucharist is symbolic: Lazarus' resurrection is symbolic; Jesus' walking on the lake of Galilee is symbolic; the healing of the blind man is symbolic; the multiplication of the bread in the gospel is symbolic, etc....everything then in the Bible is symbolic, but just like Saint Augustine said many centuries ago: "If you believe what you like in the Gospel, and reject what you don't like, it's not the Gospel you believe, but yourself".
