FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

End and beginning: It's with the end of the gospel of Matthew that we are beginning the Liturgical Year A. In the Gospel, every end is a beginning, just like The Death and Resurrection of Christ, which are the opening of a new world, the dawn of new Christmas. Today's gospel is also about the end. Talking of end, there is a heresy called millenarism sometimes interchangeable with millennialism which is the belief of the end of the world from the 1,000 years of the Book of Revelation, but also is the belief of an imminent end of the world. St Paul at the beginning of his preaching made that mistake, that means he thought that the Coming back of Christ and the end of the world were imminent. But when he wrote the Letter to the Romans a few years later, it is clear that he changed his mind, that means the end of the world will come only after a long history. Because no one knows when the end will come, today's gospel invites us to watch, to stay awake, and to be prepared.

ADVENT SEASON

Advent has a two-fold character: It's a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God, Jesus Christ to humanity is remembered. But also, our minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. Advent is also a time to recall the cry of the early Christians: Maranatha, which means "Come, Lord Jesus". The Purple Color and The Advent Wreath are the two main visible signs of the Advent Season. Advent is more a time of preparation for the Christmas Festivities than a penitential time, but the Sacrament of Recollection is also part of the Advent Season.
