PENTECOST SUNDAY

The paschal celebrations or paschal season end today with the feast of Pentecost. This word, Pentecost is a mysterious word. It comes from a Greek word which means fifty. 50 days after Easter and Saint Augustine, an excellent interpreter of the meaning of numbers in the Bible, tells us that this 50 is the number of the Holy Spirit working in human history. In today's First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, and Saint Paul's meditation in the Second Reading to the Corinthians, we cannot but marvel at the transformation caused to the Apostles: a strong wind, tongues of fire on each of them, and the ability given them to speak in different languages. Three impressive signs: wind, fire, and tongues. These 3 signs are traditionally seen in the manifestation of The Most High God. Please think of the Burning Bush and of the violent storms of Mount Sinai during the promulgation of the Tables of the Law. The sign of language is traditionally associated with the inspiration of the prophets. This gift of the Holy Spirit, the one of tongues, announces the main role of the Church (the Church being born today), to speak people's languages in order to gather them in Christ Jesus. After this powerful manifestation of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles, they are sent to mission: "RECEIVE THE HOLY SPIRIT, WHOSE SINS YOU FORGIVE ARE FORGIVEN THEM, AND WHOSE SINS YOU RETAIN ARE RETAINED". Simultaneously, the Holy Spirit was also manifested to the thousands and thousands of people gathered in Jerusalem that day, from all over the world, sign of the universality of Jesus's Death and Resurrection and of the Church's mission in the world.
