

THE SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Saint John the Baptist in today's gospel says: "A man is coming after me, who ranks ahead of me, because he existed before me". Stunning encounter in today's gospel: St John the Baptist and Jesus. The one who announces and the one who is announced. (St John the Baptist is 6 months older than Jesus, yet he says Jesus existed before him). At the beginning of his gospel, the Evangelist puts them together. The fourth gospel, that means the gospel of John, unlike Matthew, Mark and Luke goes directly into the mystery of Jesus. The other gospels present Jesus through His human genealogy. The fourth gospel goes directly to His divine nature "Behold, the lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world". St. John the Baptist passes the baton to Jesus. The Old Testament's door is closed. The last prophet, St John the Baptist introduces Jesus, and at the same time, shows us where the promised land is: Jesus Christ. St. John the Baptist is a witness to "The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world". Today, we are the new witnesses. A question arises: What kind of witnesses are we?

The Ecumenical Prayer Service will be broadcast live at 12:10 p.m. on CTV: Catholic Television of the Diocese of Scranton. It will also be made available on the Diocese of Scranton website, YouTube channel, and across all Diocesan social media platforms.
