NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME.

We continue our meditation of the Sixth chapter of the Gospel of John, the chapter about the bread of life, the Eucharist, Jesus Himself. Today's gospel helps us also to start to understand another great mystery. Jesus says: "No one can come to me unless the Father who sent me draw him, and I will raise him on the last day." Is Jesus telling us through this verse that those who follow God are God's choice? Is Jesus telling us that those who don't practice their faith or don't believe nor follow God are not chosen by God? Of course not. The next verse says this: "They shall all be taught by God," that means ALL are called and taught by Him (Jesus quotes Isaiah 54,13). But also, Paul says in First Timothy 2,4: "God wants everyone to be saved and to come to the knowledge of truth." So, it doesn't mean that God draws some people to Him and rejects others, no. God puts in EVERY single human being an interior instinct, inclination towards Him who created us all. But the problem is about an individual choice. It's something that comes from within every individual. The mystery of the personal encounter between Christ and every single human being is impenetrable (a spouse will turn to God, the other one, no. A twin will turn to God, the other one, no. A sibling will turn to God, the other one, no. But God reveals Himself to everyone, and everyone makes the choice of following God or not). Jesus continues: "Whoever eats the bread of life will live.....Whoever listens to the teaching of the Father, comes to me." Please, notice that the verb in these phrases is in the present tense, that means Jesus is not talking in the past, but in the present tense. It doesn't matter if someone listened to Jesus in the past; it is a matter of listening to Jesus now, today. Jesus' coming and manifestation into our lives is a current event, a continuous interior movement without end. And where to find the inner, the interior energy that will help our progress to God? In the bread of life, in the Eucharist.
