THE EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Vanity of vanities", says Oohelet, vanity of vanities! All things are vanities. Of all the Books of Wisdom in the Bible (these are the Wisdom Books: Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs, Wisdom, Sirach (also called Ecclesiasticus), the book of Ecclesiastes is the most famous. It speaks in a language and style that is very familiar to our time, and about our human condition: disenchantment, feeling of weariness, the apparent absurdity of life, the heaviness or sadness of our condition. "Vanity of vanities" is the general theme of the whole book. Things seem to shine under the sun, but it is only fog. However, this human experience with its limitations is an experience that every single human being must have, whether we want it or not, whether we like it or not. Our lives have this aspect of vanity that can lead us hopefully to the mystery of God. "Vanity of vanities" means we must or should rid ourselves of what is negative in us. From here, from the First Reading, we jump into the Second Reading in which St Paul gives an excellent understanding of "vanity of vanities". He invents a new word in Greek language, a new verb, the verb "raise with". This verb didn't exist before St Paul. He invents it (the verb "raise" existed before Paul, but not the verb "raised with"). And for him, the verb 'raised' (in Jesus's Resurrection) is indissolubly (that means in a way that is impossible to take apart; in a way that cannot be broken or undone) linked, attached with the preposition 'with'. St Paul is telling us that our fate, our being is united with Jesus's being in such a way that we cannot see thing anymore as "vanity". It means we are "caught up" in the mystery of a "New Man", Jesus. So, there is ONLY one person, Christ, who "is all and in all". In that sense, our life is no more "vanity of vanities". There is no more need to "store up things" for ourselves, as today's gospel puts it, but we "become rich in what matters to God".
