## SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

In today's gospel, Jesus prayed, saying: "Holy Father, I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their words, so that they all will be one, as you, Father, are in me and I, in you". Our society is familiar with the last will. Whenever we go to a doctor's office or to the hospital/Nursing Home, we always get asked about the last will. For His last will, Jesus asked His followers to be one (unity). He certainly knew what He was talking about. The past and the present of our Church tell us something about the spirit of unity, of love, of peace, and the undeniable power of the Devil, the Divider. There are more than 45,000 Christian denominations in the world, and our nation alone has more than 200. But one thing is sure, Jesus NEVER said to Peter, "you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build 200 Churches, or 45,000 Churches." Jesus NEVER said also that each of the Churches will have a parcel of truth, a tiny truth. He said: "I WILL BUILD MY CHURCH". Not Churches in plural, but one Church. The scandal of division in Christianity is from of old. The root of it all is SELFISHNESS, and personal interpretation of the Scriptures, instead of a "SUPREME COURT" body to interpret the Scriptures, the Magisterium (the teaching authority of the Roman Catholic Church). However, the multiplicity of Churches could be seen as UNIFORMITY whereas UNITY could be seen and lived in what we believe in. The Catholic Church works hard in that domain, that means she says: CAN WE AT LEAST AGREE ON JESUS' TEACHING? (Even if our practice is different). The understanding of the Bread Of Life is a beginning, because "the Eucharist makes the Church, and the Church makes the Eucharist".

## REGINA COELI PRAYER

During the Easter Season, instead of the Prayer Angelus, the Church says the Regina Coeli (Queen of Heaven). Just as the Angelus, it's said at 6 am, Noon, and 6 pm, preferably.

## **OUR SAINTS AND THE EUCHARIST**

Saint Thomas Aquinas (who else) after a dispute and division among theologians, was asked to settle the matter.
