FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

The Fourth Sunday of Easter in the Catholic Church is called the Sunday of the Good Shepherd and was designated as the World Day Prayer For Vocations. This was instituted by Pope Paul VI in 1964 because on the Fourth Sunday of Easter in the Catholic Church, we read the gospel of John presenting Jesus as The Good Shepherd. On this day, the emphasis is on the prayer to increase vocations, to support individuals who are trying to discern for their vocations, and finally to promote all types of vocations. Today the word 'shepherd' is obsolete, that means no longer used. (Our world today is more technological.) But in reality the shepherd is not a weak person. He has a tough life. He works a lot and works hard. He has lots of demands. A shepherd is a guide, someone who leads and guides with love; people today look for leaders. This is true of the youth. This is true from the point of view of believers, as well as non-believers. There are too many guides today (false ones) or no guide at all. Confusion is a very good word to describe our time. Even within the Church, there is confusion. Where is the truth? Who is telling the truth? Who to trust? Who to believe? Who to follow? In this chaos, people are lost. Some people decide not to have a guide, a shepherd. Other people decide to be their own shepherd, and being one's shepherd or guide is a dead-end road. Young people today need guides and guidance, that means shepherds; not only young people, but adults also need guides and guidance; children need guides and guidance; our society needs guides and guidance; any group of people needs guides and guidance, in politics, economy, education, military and in all types of life or domains in this life or creed, people need shepherds, that means guides and guidance. Jesus is The Good Shepherd, who gives His life and who gives eternal life. If & when we accept Christ as Shepherd, we must also accept to let Him guide us as He knows, not as we want. We don't tell Jesus what to do. "My sheep, hear my voice". To know the Gospel is not enough, but to put it into practice is what is required. The voice of the Good Shepherd in the Gospel's summarized thus: love of neighbor, need to share, fight for justice, desire for peace, necessity to forgive one's enemy, fear of God.
