THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY & JOSEPH

As faithful followers of God, Joseph, Mary, and Jesus, went up to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover. For that specific year Jesus was 12 years old. But on the way back from their pilgrimage, there was a drama. Where is Jesus? Was He kidnapped? Was He lost? Was He in an accident? They have to leave the caravan to go to the search of Jesus. Parents today know something of that kind of worry, but also the total destruction of families. After they had found Him, they witnessed an immense contrast: His stillness and the revelation He made: He is in His house whenever He is in the temple or synagogue or church or basilica: "I am in my Father's house." Pope Benedict XV instituted this Feast in 1921. When Luke wrote this gospel, he wanted to present Jesus in the temple, he wanted to let The Blessed Virgin Mary talk, he wanted to let us know the state of her mind, she "kept all these things in her heart." In her spiritual journey, the Blessed Virgin Mary did not understand immediately the depth of Jesus' words in today's gospel, "I must be in my Father's house." One understands God better when one keeps everything in the heart and meditate on it.
