

Windows Basic Command Prompt Cheat sheet

Command	Description
dir	displays a list of files and folders in the current directory.
cd	allows you to change the current directory. For example, "cd Documents" will change the current directory to the Documents folder.
mkdir	creates a new directory. For example, "mkdir newfolder" will create a new folder called "newfolder" in the current directory.
del	deletes a file. For example, "del file.txt" will delete the file "file.txt" in the current directory.
copy	copies a file. For example, "copy file.txt newfile.txt" will copy the file "file.txt" and create a new file called "newfile.txt" in the current directory.
move	moves a file from one location to another. For example, "move file.txt c:\folder" will move "file.txt" to the "folder" directory.
shutdown	allows you to shut down or restart the computer. For example, "shutdown /s" will shut down the computer and "shutdown /r" will restart it.
systeminfo	displays information about the system, including the OS name, version, and service pack, as well as system uptime and hardware information.
tasklist	displays a list of all running processes and their associated process IDs.
taskkill	stops a running process by its process ID. For example, "taskkill /PID 1234" will stop the process with the ID 1234.
