Questions to ask before hiring a lobbyist

Before your nonprofit decides to hire a paid or pro-bono lobbyist, consider these questions

WHAT YOUR NONPROFIT NEEDS TO KNOW

- Do you have a budget or are you looking for a pro-bono lobbyist?
 - Do you need a lobbyist yearround or just for a legislative
- round or just for a legislative session?
 - Do you have one specific issue or are you looking at a wide range of issues?
- Are you willing and able to travel to the capital if necessary?
 - How will you motivate and inform
- your supporters or members about the issues?
- Who will be the lobbyist's point of contact?
- Who will you be partnering with in the community?
- Do you have any relationships with elected officials currently?
- How much time can you commit to this process?

QUESTIONS TO ASK A POTENTIAL LOBBYIST

- What issues do you specialize in?
- What other nonprofits have you worked with?
- Can you provide references?
- What are your rates?
- How do you manage conflicts of interest?
- Who will be the organization's point of contact?
- What is your typical process when you have a new client?
