6. NEW BUSINESS

- a. Discussion of the detailed cost breakdown on the proposed disc golf course at Shelley Park.
- b. The Board will discuss establishing a sponsorship program for the disc golf course. Under the proposal, each hole would feature a flag displaying the name of a sponsoring business or organization. Sponsorship revenue would be used to support course improvements, maintenance, and future enhancements.
