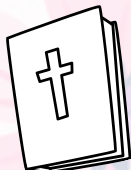

A Reflection on Sunday's Word

This message reflects on trusting God's timing and being spiritually prepared. It emphasizes that delays—like the Israelites' 40 years in the wilderness—happen when there is a lack of faith, trust, and readiness to follow His direction. Even though God's power and presence are visible every day, failing to rely on Him can keep us stuck in the same place far longer than necessary.

It encourages living each day with purpose and gratitude, as if it were your last, while continuing to grow in faith and character. The message also highlights that God often waits for the right moment and the right person to carry out His plans, reminding us that preparation matters. Ultimately, it reassures that God's plans are intentional and trustworthy, and that what lies ahead will be greater—if we remain patient, faithful, and ready to move when He calls.

A Reflection on Sunday's Word

In the journey of faith, challenges often arrive not as random acts of malice, but as purposeful examinations. When you feel the weight of an "attack" or a period of intense struggle, much like the trials faced by Job, it is helpful to view the situation through a different lens: you are being tested because there is a certainty that you will pass.

The Guardian of the Trial

The narrative of Job (1:7-12) and the promises in 1 Corinthians (10:13) suggest a profound boundary. While it may feel as though you are being pushed to your limits, there is a Divine hand maintaining the perimeter. The "adversary" may challenge you, but they cannot truly "touch" or undo you because God remains the ultimate arbiter of the test. He is not a passive observer; He is an active intervener who steps in when the breaking point is near to ensure you do not fail.

The Purpose of the Word

This strength isn't meant to be kept in a vacuum. God's sovereignty (Job 38:1-4) serves a dual purpose:

1. To provide you with a foundation of absolute control and peace.
2. To equip you with a message to "give to somebody else."

The wisdom gained during these trials is a tool for service. Even if a message feels irrelevant in your current moment, it is often a seed being planted so that you can later help someone else navigate their own storm.

The Cost of Inattention

However, the journey requires an active, listening ear. Drawing from the history of Abraham and Sarah (Genesis 17:15-16), we see that divine messages are often direct and to the point. The "consequences" we face in life frequently stem not from a lack of guidance, but from our own failure to pay attention to the directions already given.

Ultimately, the story being told is one of preparedness. By opening your heart to the word and recognizing that every test is a managed process, you move from being a victim of circumstance to a messenger of divine strength.

Identifying the Test: Looking at a current struggle, how does it change your perspective to view it as a "managed test" that you are guaranteed to pass, rather than a random attack?

The Shared Message: Is there a piece of wisdom or a "word" you've received recently that didn't seem to apply to you? Who in your life might actually need to hear that message right now?

The Power of Attention: Reflecting on the story of Abraham and Sarah, is there a "direct message" or gut feeling you've been ignoring lately? What might be the first step in paying closer attention to it?

A Short Prayer

"Lord, help me to see my challenges through Your eyes. When I feel under attack, remind me that You have set the boundaries and that You are my strength, ensuring I will not fail. Open my ears to hear Your direct instructions clearly so that I may avoid unnecessary consequences. Give me the heart to not only hold Your Word for myself but to be a vessel that shares Your peace and wisdom with others who are struggling. Amen."

A Reflection on Sunday's Word

Do You Know Who You Are in Jesus Christ?

The message began with a powerful question for the church: Do you truly know who you are in Jesus Christ? Understanding our identity is essential because when identity is lost, behavior follows.

We looked at the story of King Nebuchadnezzar in Daniel 4. His pride led him to a place of humiliation where he lived like an animal. This was not simply madness, but a moment where God allowed him to be humbled so that his heart could be restored. When Nebuchadnezzar finally lifted his eyes toward heaven, his sanity returned, and he acknowledged God as the Most High, whose kingdom and dominion are eternal. Restoration came when he recognized who God is, and who he was not.

The message then connected this to Romans 1, reminding us that when people claim wisdom apart from God, they become foolish and exchange God's truth for false images. Today, distorted identities are becoming more common in the world around us. Even as Christians, we must be careful not to adopt the world's definitions instead of God's truth. When we forget who we are in Christ, we may begin to live in ways that do not reflect our calling as sons and daughters of God.

The church was reminded that our identity should produce holy living. Scripture from 1 Corinthians made it clear that a lifestyle of unrepentant sin is not compatible with inheriting the Kingdom of God. While God is merciful and forgiving, grace is not a license to continue in sin. Our lives should reflect transformation, not compromise.

The message also acknowledged that following Christ does not mean a life without difficulty. According to 1 Peter, believers may face trials and suffering for a season. These trials are not meant to define us, but to refine us, strengthen our faith, and draw us closer to God.

The message concluded with a strong call from Hebrews 12:14: to pursue peace with everyone and to live holy lives. Holiness is not optional, it is evidence of a life that truly belongs to the Lord. Without holiness, no one will see the Lord.

Final reminder to the church:

When we forget who we are in Christ, we drift into pride, confusion, and compromise. But when we lift our eyes back to God, He restores us, grounds us in truth, and calls us to live lives that honor Him.

A Reflection on Sunday's Word

Today's message reminded us that God promises to direct our paths when we acknowledge Him in everything we do. Using the image of a roundabout, we were encouraged to see how God often leads us through seasons of uncertainty not to confuse us, but to guide and protect us.

We were reminded that before entering God's plan, we must first yield to Him through surrender and submission. Refusing to yield leads to chaos and misdirection, but trusting God brings peace and clarity. As believers, we are called to walk by faith and not by sight, continuing to move forward in obedience even when we don't fully understand where God is leading.

The message also emphasized the importance of waiting on God's timing. Just as drivers sometimes must circle a roundabout until it's safe to exit, there are moments when God asks us to wait. Not every opportunity is the right one, and God may delay an exit to protect us, strengthen our faith, and develop our character.

We were encouraged to follow the signs God has given us through His Word, which lights our path and keeps us from taking the wrong direction. In every season whether yielding, waiting, or moving forward we are called to trust that God is working for our good.

The message closed with the reminder that when the time is right, God will clearly open the door He has prepared for us. And when God opens a door, no one can shut it.

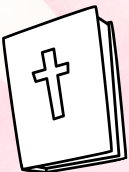

A Reflection on Sunday's Word

Today's message emphasizes that God's love is constant, unconditional, and demonstrated through sacrifice—especially through Jesus dying for humanity. Even though humans fail and sin, God remains faithful, compassionate, and willing to forgive repeatedly, calling people to learn obedience and grow closer to Him.

It also highlights that God's love is not dependent on human perfection but on His unchanging nature, which offers hope and reassurance to believers. Teachings from the Bible are used to remind believers that obedience, forgiveness, and compassion should shape daily life.

Overall, the focus is on reassurance that no matter how many times someone fails, God's mercy remains available and He continues to restore those who turn back to Him.

A Reflection on Sunday's Word

The message focused on the truth that unless God is the one building, our efforts will not produce lasting fruit. A "house" represents every area of life: our homes, families, careers, ministries, and personal callings. God brings transformation, and transformation is often uncomfortable. Declaring who Jesus is and living out faith publicly is not easy, but when we are on a mission from God, we stand firmly on His Word.

The church's current season is a testimony of God's faithfulness, shaped by prayer, sacrifice, and growth. While buildings and seasons change, God remains constant. He does not just give buildings. He gives purpose and mission. God goes before His people, performs miracles, and fulfills His promises.

The message concluded by emphasizing that a building does not make a church great people surrendered to God do. This move is not about comfort but about preparation for greater impact, growth, and ministry. If God brought us this far, He is not finished yet.

A Reflection on Sunday's Word

In a world filled with confusion, noise, and conflicting messages, Jesus warns in Matthew 24 that many will come claiming authority or truth, leading others astray. Wars, unrest, and deception are not signs to panic, but reminders that Scripture is unfolding exactly as foretold. Believers will face pressure, temptation, and opposition, and false prophets will attempt to distort the truth. Endurance, faithfulness, and discernment are essential during these times.

The Bible shows that God is deeply involved in human history and emotion—grieved by sin (Genesis 6:6), seeking relationship with humanity (Genesis 3:9), and ultimately acting in love through Christ. John 3:16–18 reveals the heart of the gospel: God's love is demonstrated through Jesus, offering salvation rather than condemnation to those who believe.

Isaiah 45:7 reminds us that God remains sovereign even when circumstances are difficult or unclear. Good and evil exist together in the world, much like the wheat and weeds growing side by side, making discernment crucial. The only way to truly know right from wrong is to personally know God's Word, rather than relying solely on what others say.

The message calls believers to stand firmly on truth when ideas are challenged, rumors spread, and faith is tested. Faith is not meant to be practiced only on Sundays, but lived out daily through obedience, integrity, and speaking truth in love. God invites people to come as they are—broken, uncertain, or searching—with the promise that He will bring transformation. Through knowing His Word and walking in it daily, believers can remain grounded, faithful, and confident in a confusing world, trusting always that God is good, all the time.

A Reflection on Sunday's Word

Parable of the Workers in the Vineyard (Matthew 20:1-16)

The Core Message: Grace Over Merit

The central theme is that God's Kingdom operates on a different economy than the world. While we often demand "fairness" based on hours worked or effort exerted, God provides based on His generosity.

- ⌘ The Equal Reward: Whether called at dawn or the eleventh hour, every worker receives the same "denarius." This symbolizes that salvation and God's favor are gifts of grace, not wages to be earned.
- ⌘ Obedience over Seniority: God does not measure us by the length of our service, but by our willingness to say "yes" when called.

Lessons from the Marketplace

The text breaks down the symbolism of the landowner and the laborers:

- ⌘ The Idle Life: Standing in the marketplace symbolizes a life without purpose. God "persistently seeks" people to move them from idleness into meaningful work.
- ⌘ The Different Stages: People are called at early, mid, and late stages of life. This reminds us that it is never too late to begin, but it also warns that the opportunity ends when life ends (the "12th hour").
- ⌘ The Comparison Trap: A major hurdle in spiritual growth is comparing our blessings or paths to others. The text emphasizes that serving God is a privilege to be embraced, not a contest to be won.

Redefining Greatness and Service

Following Jesus is presented as a path of servanthood rather than a climb to power.

- ⌘ The Shift in Perspective: True greatness in the Kingdom is found in service (Matthew 20:26).
- ⌘ The Sacrifice: Humans often resist the sacrifices required for the Kingdom because we don't fully see the "big picture."
- ⌘ Finding Balance: In an unbalanced world, balance is found by "Seeking first the Kingdom of God" (Matthew 6:33).

The Takeaway: It's okay to struggle with these concepts or disagree with the "unfairness" of it all. The text acknowledges that we don't always understand God's ways, but the call remains the same: **Follow Him.**

A Reflection on Sunday's Word

Gods word is Faithful

In the story, Zacchaeus, it reveals that Jesus can change anyone, no matter their past. Zacchaeus sensed something missing in his life, which stirred his desire to see Jesus. When Jesus saw him, called him by name, and chose to stay with him, that encounter became life-changing. Being truly seen, heard, and known is a deep human need, and Jesus meets that need with truth and grace.

This passage teaches that truth alone sets us free and helps us discover who we really are. While Satan exploits moments of feeling overlooked or forgotten to pull us away from ourselves, others, and God, Jesus does the opposite: He stays present, inviting us into a secure relationship with Him. Zacchaeus did not abandon his career, but his encounter with Jesus transformed how he lived and used it.

Ultimately, today's message reminds us that unforgettable encounters with Jesus leave a lasting imprint. When we see Jesus seeing us, our lives are changed. Jesus sees you, saves you, and is ready to transform your purpose.

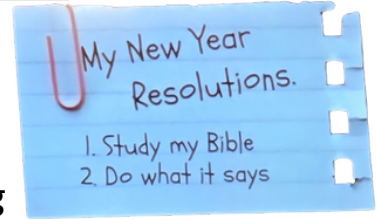

While people often resolve to save money, get fit, or improve habits, the idea of resolutions dates back to ancient Babylon, where people made promises to false gods. In contrast, the Bible teaches that true freedom and right living come from "truth", not comforting lies (John 8:25-35).

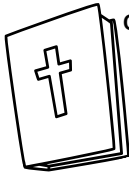
Truth is defined as what is real, genuine, and factual, and many people struggle to truly know themselves. Life brings opposition, but believers are called to "stand on God's truth" Daniel 3:16 illustrates this through Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, who chose faithfulness to God over safety, showing unwavering trust even in danger.

The Bible presents an ongoing struggle between "truth and deception", emphasizing that walking in God's light brings clarity. Love and truth must work together—love without truth can mislead (1 John 3:18). Believers are encouraged to operate in "love and truth" by embracing faith (Hebrews 11:6), practicing love (Matthew 22:37-39), obeying God (John 14:15), reflecting God's image (Ephesians 2:10), and trusting God's purpose (Jeremiah 29:11).

The core resolution for 2026 is to "build a stronger relationship with God, the church, and one's faith", trusting that God stands with those who endure and live by His truth.

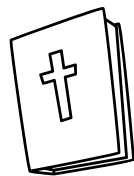

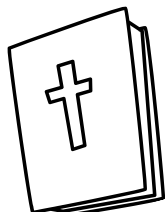

Seeds of Change: Living the Great Commission
