CDCTS MEETING MINUTES, NOVEMBER 18, 2025

Call to Order: President Carolyn Ordal called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m. Present were board members, Carolyn Ordal, Rita Dunn, Lynn Holtman, Kacy Schnake, Julie Noe, Sloan Adams and Danielle McKensey. Guests were Coy Jo Bays, Julie Hall and Danielle's daughter, CeCe.

Approval of the Minutes: Minutes for October were unanimously approved.

Treasurer's Report: Kacy Schnake gave treasurer's report.

Approval of Treasurer's Report: The treasurer's report for October was approved.

Old Business

Christmas Party: Rita Dunn has graciously offered to host it again this year. CDCTS usually provides a ham and drinks—wine, sodas, etc. Everyone who attends is asked to bring a side dish or dessert. The “dirty Santa” game is popular. If one wants to participate, you bring a wrapped gift (up to \$25 in value) and place it under the tree (anonymously). Everyone draws a number. Person #1 picks a gift and opens it. Person #2 can pick a gift from under the tree or “steal the gift from Person #1. Person #1, then picks another gift. Future of the Club: Last month we talked about the continuing difficulties in getting volunteers for shows. Many suggestions were made by different people. New Business

Carolyn Ordal will check with Dene Masengill about hosting our Spring Schooling Show and what dates would work well for that. The suggestion was made that the June Schooling Show be at Jennifer Bolen's as she has a covered arena. The decision was made to contact Emily Rose and enlist her to do a clinic with us when she is at UTK in July 2026. Kacy Schnake volunteered to make that contact.

USEA News: Effective December 1, 2025, Tennessee will move from Area III to Area VIII. This change will better align eventing calendars and competition styles within the region. Area VIII will now include Tennessee with current Area VIII states Kentucky, Ohio, Indiana, Michigan, and West Virginia.

US EQUESTRIAN RIDING STANDARDS FOR DRESSAGE

Lexington, Ky. - Earlier this fall, US Equestrian released a series of Horse Welfare Guidelines to members, including those based on the familiar concept of a spotlight guidance recently published by USEF. In addition to this work, the USEF Dressage Equine Ethics and Wellbeing Task Force led by Betsy Juliano and Lisa Gorretta, has been meeting regularly to discuss changes needed nationally within the discipline of dressage.

As a result of the Task Force discussions Riding Standard Guidelines have been drafted for the consideration of dressage athletes looking to progress up the levels in a harmonious way with their horses. We encourage athletes, trainers, and our dressage community to share these guidelines and implement them into their daily practice and review before competing.

Anatomy of a Successful Experience - Determining If You Are Ready to Move Up to the Next Level

Basic questions to ask yourself as a baseline as to whether you're ready to compete at the next level:

- If you practice a movement included in the next level of competition, are you able to consistently meet the requirements of that movement and the directives stated in the test?
- On average, are you and your horse reasonably confirmed at the current level you are competing with a score reflecting competency, such as 63% or higher?
- Does your horse willingly perform the movements required for the level at which you are considering competing?
- Are you familiar with the new movements to be asked at the next level and the characteristics defining each of them? Consequently, are you and your horse proficient and confident in performing the movements as they are required in the test?

Strategies for a Successful Experience

- As a general rule, follow the adage of competing at the level below you are currently training.
- Read the test directives to ensure you understand the factors the judge(s) will be using for consideration when determining a score for each movement.
- As you move up the levels, it can feel like the movements come very quickly in succession during a test. Before competing at a higher level, practice the test at home enough times so you feel you have time to prepare for each movement.
- Know the core movements "define a level." These may be underlying what is described in the Purpose listed in the test. For example, at First Level Test 3, the 10m circles and broken lines are intended to test acceptance of the aids used for bending and turning. Second Level introduces collection and the movements which help to develop it, such as shoulder-in and turn on the haunches.
- At the end of your show season, first make sure you can answer yes to all of the questions posed above and then make a thoughtful evaluation of your competition experiences. Consider both you and your horse's strengths, as well as the areas in need of improvement. The next level will not only include new movements, but heightened expectations of your horse's balance, engagement, and self-carriage, which requires time, training, and the building of strength and fitness.
- Make a training plan which takes advantage of educational and observational opportunities such as ride-a-tests and schooling shows.
- When you feel your horse is confirmed in the daily work and they fulfill the "Purposes" defined in the test, you can be confident you are ready to begin competing at the new level.

Are You and Your Horse Ready to Move Up?

Additional topics being discussed by the USEF Dressage Equine Ethics and Wellbeing Task Force include:

- Review of tack and equipment permitted in competition, including double bridles, whips, and spurs
- Review of training methods and equipment used out of competition
- Warm-up behaviors
- Frequency of showing
- Blood rules
- Coach certification



Updates and further expansion of the above areas will be communicated to membership throughout the 2026 calendar year.

General Rules:

- Awards for Rated and Schooling Shows will be divided into the following categories: AA, JR/YR, and Open. At each level one award will be issued in each category. Minimum qualifying scores apply at each level (see chart above).

For Rated Shows: Intermediate I and II will be considered 1 level. Musical Freestyles 1st – 4th will be considered 1 level, and FEI Musical Freestyles will be considered 1 level for awards purposes. All other levels, Training thru Grand Prix, will be considered separately for awards at Rated Shows.

For Schooling Shows: All FEI tests will be considered 1 level for awards purposes. All other levels, Intro thru 4th, will be considered separately for awards at Schooling Shows. Musical Freestyles from all levels will be considered 1 level for awards purposes.

- AA and JR/YR status MUST be stated on the front of the score sheet or it will otherwise be considered Open.
- Awards are based on percentage, not placing in the class.
- Awards are based on horse/rider combination. The rider must have been a CDCTS member at the time of the show. Riders who submit a membership application on the date of the show will also be eligible for year-end awards.
- The horse/rider combination must submit at least 3 scores from 2 different judges at 2 different shows. At least 1 score must be derived from the highest test of that level.
- Tabulation of scores shall be based on the average of the scores submitted for each level.
- All riders are responsible for mailing or emailing in copies of their tests. A copy of the USDF Rider Scorecard from usdfscores.com will be accepted in lieu of a test copy. Original tests will not be returned. Photocopies of tests or the USDF Rider Scorecard must be received by December 1, 2025 and test copies MUST SHOW TEST SIGNED BY THE JUDGE.
- At Combined Test competitions, only horses designated “Dressage Only” will be allowed to send in scores.
- Horse and rider combinations showing at more than one level during the awards year will only be eligible for awards at one level. The rider may choose which level they would like to be eligible for awards, and only submit scores for that level. If scores are submitted for more than one level, only shows scores earned at the highest level will be considered for year-end awards purposes.

- Horse/rider combinations are not eligible to win an award at the same level in consecutive or subsequent years with the exception of the FEI levels (Prix St George thru Grand Prix) which will allow eligibility to win an award at the same level more than one time in consecutive or subsequent years.
- Only scores from the current competition year (Dec 1 – Nov. 30) will count towards year-end awards.
- A member must have four volunteer hours to qualify for CDCTS Awards. There will be a sign-up sheet at each event that has volunteer opportunities. You will have already been contacted to volunteer at an event, but it is up to the individual to sign in and out on that particular event's volunteer roster to get the required four hours. See Volunteer Requirements for additional information.
- Combined Training Awards will be presented at each level, Novice through Prelim, for both schooling shows and rated events to a rider in each category: Open, Adult Amateur, Junior/Young Rider. General rules apply.
- Western Dressage/Gaited Dressage Awards will be presented at each level, Intro through Level 4, for both schooling shows and rated events to a rider in each category: Open, Adult Amateur, Junior/Young Rider. General rules apply.
- Working Equitation Awards will be presented at each level, Level 1 through Level 7, for both schooling shows and rated events to a rider in each category: Open, Adult Amateur, Junior/Young Rider. General rules apply.

NON-RIDING AWARDS

MERRY HOUR AWARD – created to honor Carol Grau, as the founding member of the club and her legacy of service to our equestrian community. This award is intended to recognize an outstanding, long-time CDCTS member who has embodied the mission statement of the club, with a long history of service to the club.

LAUREL ANN CROWE AWARD – a perpetual trophy presented each year to the club member with the lowest combined training score at a schooling show.

JACK FOSTER PERPETUAL AWARD – given each year to the club member with the highest point score at Training Level or above from a schooling show sanctioned by CDCTS. The Jack Foster Award was conceived by the club in the 1990's as a memorial to the husband of Karen Foster, a past president of the club. At one time the club put on 3-4 rated shows in Harriman. Jack volunteered to announce all day long at every one of them. He died suddenly of a heart attack in his mid-forties. It is a perpetual trophy, and each year a new plaque is added to the base to display the name of that year's award winner. The winner keeps the trophy until the following year, when another plaque is added, and another winner takes the trophy home for a year.

ALECE ELLIS VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR PERPETUAL AWARD – This award was converted to a perpetual award beginning in 2022, in honor of Alece Ellis who passed away in December 2021. Alece was the epitome of what a volunteer looks like. She was always silently in the background and could be found at almost every local horse show or event where dressage or working equitation was present. Alece was often found beside the judge as a scribe, tallying up scores in the show office, learning to become a Technical Delegate in WE, or just on the sidelines cheering the participants on. This award is designed to recognize the member who has helped the club by volunteering personal time and talent throughout the year. Each year a new plaque is added to the base to display the name of that year's award winner. The winner keeps the trophy until the following year, when another plaque is added and another winner takes the trophy home for a year.

WALNUT GROVE PERPETUAL TROPHY – Will be awarded to the individual with the High Point Western/Gaited Dressage score.

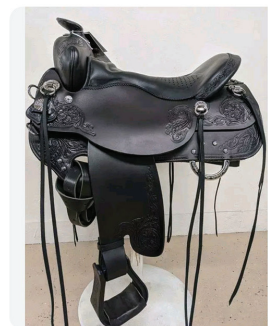
