Oldenburg approved mare that was Champion at her foal inspection. She was Champion at her inspection for non-Hanoverian mares when being approved for Hanoverian breeding. Peugeot was in training and injured an eye very badly; this injury ended her possible show career. She is sired by Hanoverian stallion Pablito and out of a Thoroughbred mare. Pablito has extensive blood lines for both dressage and jumping. Currently priced at \$12,500.

Wregan Rocks is a 3 year old, bright, flashy chestnut Hanoverian gelding with two white rear stockings and a star and stripe. Wregan is currently doing ground work, and has a great, willing disposition.

He is sired by European champion Grand Prix stallion Wild Dance /WolkensteinII/Matcho. In Germany, his sire won his stallion testing with 147 in Dressage and Rideability and 9's in his jumping ability and has several offspring at the Grand Prix level. The dam is Porscha, an Oldenburg/Hanoverian approved mare. Wregan was Porscha's first foal and she outdid herself with him. He is a beautiful mover as well as a looker. Porscha had a very short show career; during her career she scored in the 70's in her only two shows and won all her classes with Missy Cool riding and training her. She was injured during a pre-purchase exam and became a mom for two years. She is now back in training. Currently priced at \$14,000.

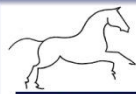

The undersigned Exhibitor and any signing parent or guardian hereby (1) agrees to release CDCTS and Icon Sporthorses LLC, its officers, directors, employees, members or agents, and the Owners or managers of the grounds where this event is held from any loss, damage, liability or injury arising out of or resulting from this show or Exhibitor's participation or entry therein; (2) agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend: the organizer, facility owner and the management of this show from and against any and all claims for loss, damage or injury, however caused, resulting directly or indirectly from Exhibitors entry or participation in this show or from acts or omissions of Exhibitors or Exhibitors agents; (3) acknowledges that activities with and around horses and horse shows involve inherent risks which are understood by the person signing and are expressly assumed. In the event of injury to Exhibitor or to Exhibitor's animal or animals, permission is hereby granted to management for emergency medical treatment.

WARNING: Under Tennessee law an equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities pursuant to Tennessee code annotated Title 44, Chapter 20, Section 1.

Competitor Information

Entries:

All entries MUST include a copy of a current negative Coggins. The CDCTS and ICON release forms must be filled out, signed and dated by rider and/or parent or guardian if rider is younger than 18 years old. Stallions are permitted to show at ICON.

Payment in full must accompany the entry form. If payment has not been received by closing date of September 8, 2017, the entry will be void.

Refunds: No cash refunds after closing date. Show credit will be given with a veterinarian's or a doctor's certificate/letter. RETURNED CHECKS for NSF will incur a \$40.00 fee and a void entry.

Due Date: Entries are due to the Show Secretary postmarked no later than September 8, 2017

Awards: Ribbons will be awarded in all classes of placements 1st through 6th place. Winners of High Point Dressage (Training Level and above) and Best Score Combined Training (Elementary Novice and above) will also receive a neck sash, a voucher from the sponsor and a horse head statue.

Arena: All Dressage Tests will be ridden in the indoor arena. Footing is silica sand and textile.

Dressage tests Intro, A, B and C and CT dressage tests Preliminary Test A and below will be ridden in a 20 m x 40 m arena. All other dressage tests, including Preliminary Test B and Intermediate A and B, will be ridden in a 20 m x 60 m arena. Jumping will be in the fenced-in outdoor arena. Footing is silica sand and textile

Attire: Appropriate informal schooling attire is required. ASTM-SEI approved helmets and appropriate footwear is required and must be worn at all times when mounted.

Parking: Ample parking for cars and horse trailers. Cars will be parked separately from trailers. Trailers will be parked in the field immediately to the right as you enter the property. Volunteers will be on hand to assist with parking. Please follow the guidance of the volunteers, **park only in designated areas.**

Ride Times: Official ride times will be posted on the CDCTS website and Facebook page on Thursday September 14, 2017 after 6 pm.

Concessions: will be on the premises

Dogs: No dogs allowed. No exceptions

Equine Activity Liability Release, Waiver of Rights to Sue and Assumption of all Risks

1. This Agreement is given under the Tennessee Code Annotated, title 44, chapter 20 (Acts 1992, Ch. 974, s 6.) as it may now provide or be hereafter amended (the "Code"). All terms defined by the Code shall have the same meaning herein, and the Code is hereby incorporated in this Agreement by reference. This Agreement shall be so construed as to provide to Icon Sporthorses, LLC the fullest protection of a release, waiver of right to sue and assumption of all risks which is afforded to the Icon Sporthorses, LLC by the Code. I understand and agree that Icon Sporthorses, LLC is considered an "equine professionals" as used by the Code (see attached Code).
2. I understand that I am required to use ASTM/SEI protective headgear. I further acknowledge that I am required to wear protective footwear with heels. Icon Sporthorses, LLC is not responsible if the proper headgear is not ASTM/SEI approved.
3. The undersigned hereby acknowledges that he/she has full and complete notice and understanding of the Code and of all the risks inherent to equine activities which may cause, contribute to or result in the death or personal injury of the participant or damage to the participant's property (the "Risks"), including, but not limited to: (i) the propensity of an equine to behave in dangerous ways or to tip and/or fall; (ii) the inability of anyone whomsoever to predict or foresee an equine's reaction to excitement, weather conditions, sound, movements, objects, persons, animal, reptiles, birds or insects, and the effects of such reactions; (iii) the hazards of surface or subsurface conditions, including but not limited to objects or conditions on, under or protruding from the surface, both latent and patent; (iv) the hazards which rocks, cliffs, hills fences, trees, stumps, logs, bridges, ditches and other debris and obstacles, and any equine activities in connection therewith, may foreseeably or unforeseeably present; (v) the dangers and risks of tack or harness slipping or breaking for whatever reason; (vi) the dangers and risks of becoming entangled in tack, harness, or vehicles used in an equine activity, (vii) the risks of falling from or otherwise becoming unstable on an equine or a vehicle used in an equine activity for any reason whatsoever or for no identifiable reason and (viii) any negligent act or omission by Icon Sporthorses, LLC which causes or results in the death or personal injury of the participant or damage to the participant's property.
4. The participant hereby RELEASES and WAIVES all rights which he/she may have or hereafter have against Icon Sporthorses, LLC for death, personal injury or property damage which is in any way associated with the Risks; he/she does hereby WAIVE his/her right to sue or to bring any action against Icon Sporthorses, LLC in connection therewith; he/she agrees to INDEMNIFY and DEFEND Icon Sporthorses, LLC from and to HOLD Icon Sporthorses, LLC HARMLESS against any such suit or action, and he hereby expressly ASSUMES ALL RISKS AND DANGERS of death, personal injury and property damage which are in any way associated with the Risks enumerated in paragraph 2, above.
5. The participant hereby authorizes and consents to any emergency medical care which may at the time appear reasonably appropriate under the circumstances as a result of injury or sickness caused by or incurred in the course of an equine activity.
6. The Agreement shall remain valid and in full force and effect from and after the date opposite the signature of the participant until expressly revoked by the participant in a written notice personally delivered to the owners of Icon Sporthorses, LLC and Icon Sporthorses, LLC.
7. To the extent possible, the Agreement shall be construed in such a manner as will render it, and each provision of it, fully enforceable; but if any provision of the Agreement shall be unenforceable, such provision (or so much thereof as is unenforceable) shall be deleted and the remainder of the Agreement shall continue in full force and effect.

8. If this Agreement is executed by the undersigned participant for and on behalf of a minor participant named below, the undersigned participant hereby warrants and represents that he/she is in fact the legal parent or guardian of such minor, with full rights of custody and control; that this Agreement is given on behalf of and is intended to be binding upon said minor participant, his/her heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns; and the undersigned participant further agrees that this Agreement shall also be as fully binding on the undersigned participant as if it were entered into solely on his own behalf.
9. This Agreement shall be binding upon the heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns of the participates
10. I HAVE FULL READ, FULLY UNDERSTAND, AND VOLUNTARILY SIGN THE FOREGOING EQUINE LIABILITY RELEASE WAIVER OF RIGHT TO SUE AND ASSUMPTION OF ALL RISKS. I HAVE CONSULTED AND RELIED UPON MY OWN ADVISORS ON ALL QUESTIONS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, AND I HAVE NOT RELIED UPON THE SPONSOR/PROFESSIONAL OR ANY OWNER FOR ANY ADIVSE OR EXPLANATION OIN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

CDCTS Schooling Shows General Rules

All shows are run under the general rules of USEF, unless otherwise specified.

Approved protective headgear and footwear with appropriate heels must be worn whenever mounted.

All schooling shows offer current: USDF Introductory Levels, USEF Training through Fourth Level, FEI levels, Rider tests, USEA Eventing tests, Pas de Deux and Musical Freestyles (all levels)

It is hoped that riders take pride in their turnout. Coats are encouraged, but not required. Plain white riding shirts or polo-style shirts with dark breeches are also appropriate. T-shirts are not permitted. Note: during hot weather, riders are encouraged to show without coats in the interest of their health.

Braiding the mane is encouraged, but not required.

The following equipment is forbidden at a dressage show: martingales of any kind; bearing, side or running reins; seat covers; and any form of blinkers.

The following equipment is permitted in warm-up areas: running martingales, bandages, boots and side reins.

All equipment, including whips, bits and spurs must comply with USEF rules.

Ear nets are permitted; fly masks are not allowed.

No bareback riding is allowed.

A rider should not be judged by anyone who has instructed him/her within the last 30 days (exception: attending clinics). If you arrive at the show and find that your instructor has been substituted for the judge, notify the show manager and ask to ride *hors concours*, or don't ride and receive a full credit for your entry fees.

If you are riding a musical freestyle, please bring your own music and boom box.

Check your score before you leave the show grounds. Any scoring errors must be reported and corrected before you leave the show grounds. After that time, no corrections can be made.

Please note that classes do not always go in order of lowest to highest. Classes at shows may be scheduled in any order throughout the day.

Classes may be split or combined, depending on the number and distribution of entries.

If you intend to bring a horse that is not competing onto the show grounds, this must be cleared with the show manager prior to the show date, and will be at his/her discretion. If permitted by the manager, you must bring a current negative Coggins test to the show grounds and present it to the manager upon your arrive and before you unload your horse and also pay the non-compete fee.

Show Etiquette

Be considerate of other riders in the warm-up area. Pass left-shoulder to left-shoulder and yield to those who are moving at faster gaits.

Arrive outside the ring approximately one minute before your ride time, having already warmed up your horse. You will have 45 seconds to enter the ring once the judge has rung the bell.

If your ride is not next, please do not congregate with your horse around the arena entrance.

Lunging is prohibited in the warm-up area; check with the show manager or warm-up ring steward about where lunging is permitted on the show grounds.

Be courteous to the judge and show volunteers.

Should you need to excuse yourself from the ring during your test for any reason, be sure to ask for the judge's permission prior to exiting the ring.

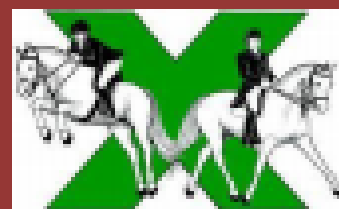
Leave your trailer site clean; pick up all trash and manure.

Obey all rules of the facility where the show is held. (for example: where to park, no smoking, no dogs, etc)

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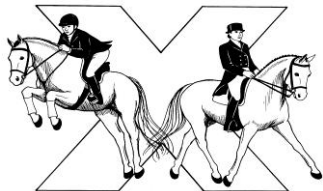
