We were low on volunteers and I appreciate everyone who stepped up. Thanks to the wonderful Debbie Schwartz, our judge. Your kind comments will help all of us improve for our next shows.

July 12-13 is the second in our series of clinics with Cathy Zappe. It will be held at Red Oak Hill Farm (Shannon O'Hatnicks farm). Their covered arena will be very welcome for this July clinic. Space is limited. The online registration form is available and make sure you sign up. The third Cathy Zappe clinic will be October 18-19.

## **Girths and Cinchas!**

From measuring what size you need, to choosing a material, or a shape, the market is Saturated with options! How to choose? Let's disassemble the confusion! This will be the first of several installments covering all things girth related! Over



the next few newsletters, we will cover: Materials, Shape, and Fitting & Construction.

Let's begin with materials. Which material is best for your horse, your climate, your disciple or workload? Let's dive in! (For the purpose of this article, I'll be using girth to cover western cinches too, don't be confused by the general nomenclature of this portion)

#### **Materials**

**Wool Felt** - Like wool saddle pads, wool girths are one of my favorite materials! But not all wool girths are made equally -wool quality and thickness will play a part in which girth you choose. I always recommend purchasing the softest, springiest, thickest material you can find and afford. Good wool will sit snugly against the horse and absorb pressure, heat & sweat. These girths will be a good choice for any horse, and any climate, and are also great options for horses with sensitive skin and/ or prone to rubs. The drawback - you must keep regular cleaning/maintenance on the girth to ensure dirt, sweat & hair don't buildup & cause rubs.

**Wool Fleece** - perceived as the ultimate girth material for English riders and gaining popularity in the Western world, wool fleece is the most forgiving material for sensitive horses. The deep pile (thickness) of fleece girths is an amazing shock absorber and sweat wicker, which dissipates heat from the horse, which is important in the Southeast! The drawbacks are, when new especially, you can't tighten this type of girth very snug and on a round horse, this could cause saddle slippage. These girths are also known for their maintenance - a wool friendly shampoo needs to be used regularly, dried thoroughly and re"fluffed" to maintain the pile and prevent matting. (An air compressor is a wonderful tool to refluff wool!)

**Synthetic Fleece** - This type of fleece has lovely shock absorbing properties and is easier to care for than natural fleece. Like natural wool, it is a nice option for sensitive horses who need more even pressure and a pressure deadening effect. The fleece still needs to be cleaned and fluffed regularly to maintain these properties, so the level of care remains the same as a natural wool girth. A strong drawback to this material in our climate is the lack of heat & sweat dissipation as synthetics will create & trap heat. I never recommend this material for riders who ride for long hours because of this.

### GIRTHS AND CINCHAS! - CONTINUED

*Elastic* - fully elastic girths are tough to find but are available on the market. These girths are 100% elastic, all the way around, not just the buckle portion. They are typically breathable even though they are a synthetic material. Quick drying and easy to care for, these girths can wear out quickly (Lose elasticity) and can be overtightened easily, so beware when tacking up!

Air (covered) - girths utilizing air are making a return to the market. Like air panels in saddles, these girths have an air bladder on known pressure points with the intent to distribute that pressure by utilizing air pressure. These girths, when overtightened, can cause the air bladder to compress to a point of hardness. The bladders are soft and can be a good option for horses with sensitivity on the sternum & ribs. Like air paneled saddle, these bladders have a lifespan and need to be checked regularly to ensure the bladder is intact & working as intended. These girths may also come in a variety of covering materials, but the most common is a synthetic leather/foam/neoprene type material, so consider the skin contact material in your decision as well.

Gel (covered) - Much like the Air girths, gel girths are an ever-popular choice in the market. The intent is to distribute pressure and allow for some movement of the horse to continually redistribute the gel pressure. Like the air girths, overtightening these girths can cause unintentional pressure instead of relieving it. Gel is also known to create & trap heat, so choosing the correct covering becomes an important choice too.

Leather - a time-tested favorite! I don't think that leather is ever a bad choice! Easy to care for, longlasting, typically soft & malleable for the horse's shape, leather (if constructed properly, covered in Part 3) is always a top choice.

**Cotton** - Cotton girths can be found in string and flat varieties. The ease of care for cotton girths is a large bonus - most can be washed in a washing machine and hung to dry. Cotton has little stretch after the first few uses and will typically mold to your horse once tightened. A drawback is that.

**Mohair String** - Mohair is a very traditional material that is strong, durable, and easy to care for. Its breathability and quick drying properties make it a wonderful choice for our climate! While traditionally used for Western Cinches, makers in the US also tie girths for English as well. Mohair comes in a variety of colors to suit your horse or color pallets, too. Mohair will stretch slightly within the first few uses, so ask your maker how much to expect and account for this in your length choice.

**Synthetic String** - string girths made with synthetic string/rope material are all over the internet at the moment. While durable and affordable, these girths are most likely to gall your horse within a few rides due to the abrasive nature of synthetic threads within the string. I do not recommend this type of girth material in any presentation. Invest in a better material, even if you need to save money for the purchase or find one used.

\*\*Disclaimer: While most of us don't perform this ritual after every ride, girths need to be cared for as intently as we care for our saddles, bridles & leg protection. Routine care will extend the life of your equipment and ensure a happy horse! Happy Riding! Amanda

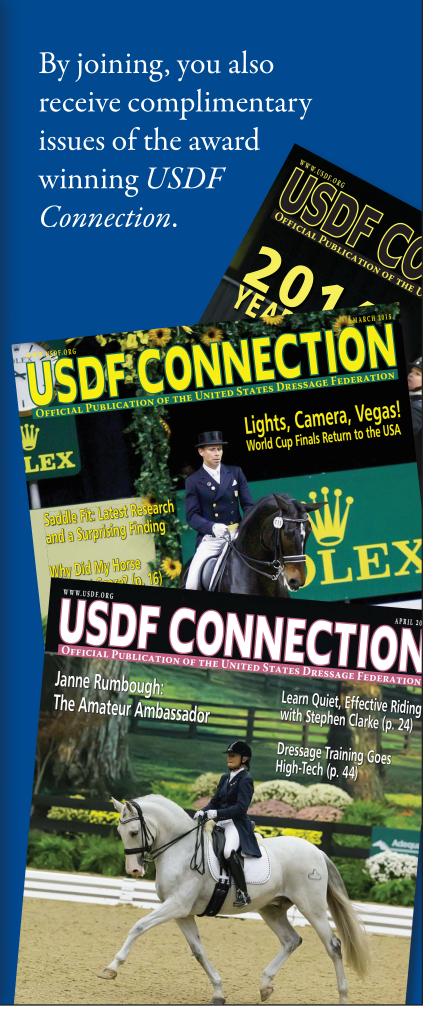
