Cathy grew up showing, showjumping and doing equitation and played mounted games and polocrosse for fun. She has also evented to prelim level. She is USDF Bronze, Silver and Gold medalist as well as a Freestyle Gold medalist. Currently she has students that are competing at all levels of dressage and some from other disciplines. Her focus is primarily on rider balance and the correct use of the aids and how this influences the horse. (And we all know that riding is all about balance and rhythm!) She is passionate about her teaching and improving the communication between rider and horse.

This will be a great clinic; a few spots are still available on Saturday and several places open on Sunday for riders. We are doing an online registration form which is listed on the flyer, in this newsletter and on the CDCTS website. CDCTS members can audit the clinic for free.

Approval of the January 2025 Minutes: (There was not a February meeting) Lynn Holtman moved the January 2025 minutes be approved. Diane Carlson seconded the motion and all approved

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Kacy Schnake gave the treasurer's report. Rita Dunn moved to approve the Treasurer's Report. Lynn Holtman seconded the motion and it was unanimously.

Old Business

2025 Memberships: How many have been renewed? We are currently at 28 members. We have ads for Renaissance Farm, the Barn Fairy and Cider Wafers in newsletter. Have any of them renewed a professional membership? Contact them with both individual and professional forms. Cathy Fox will submit her professional membership. Kacy Schnake and Carolyn Ordal will contact the others to see if they are interested in renewing their professional memberships as well as contacting previous members about renewing. Amanda Cross said that folks in the Crossville area are not aware of CDCTS and the shows/clinics offered. She will share a list of organizations/stables with Carolyn.

Annual Banquet: The banquet went well, although a small number of attendees. Money made from the silent auction paid for the dinner. Appreciate everyone who got donations for the silent auction. Rita Dunn won the contest with getting \$700 in donations. Thanks to Dave McAdoo for giving a brief talk about trailer maintenance. It was well received and many questions asked. Susan Hill distributed the monogrammed award items for the 2024 Board Members. Carolyn Ordal will deliver the monogrammed award items to Linda Bird and Mike Sullivan. (Monogrammed award items were not presented award recipients at the banquet due to unforeseen circumstances.)

Future of the Club: Surveys gathering information regarding the future of the club were distributed during the banquet. Eight surveys were completed and turned in at the banquet. One survey recommendation was to have more clinics and fewer shows. Surveys emailed to members have not, as yet, been returned. Clinicians need to be contacted and availability and prices. Crossroads Dressage and Combined Training Society is pleased to offer a Clinic with Cathy Zappe, April 26-27, 2025.

Cathy Zappe is a superb clinician from Huntsville, AL and will be at Topperhill Farm in Lenoir City, April 26-27. Online clinic registrations will be sent to CDCTS members and be on our website shortly. Spaces are limited, so sign up quickly!

Cathy grew up riding in South Africa and began teaching at the age of sixteen. Since moving to the U.S. in 1999, she has received her USDF Bronze, Silver, and Gold Medals, as well as her Freestyle Gold Bar. She also has her USDF Instructor Certification through 4th level, and was given 94% for her teaching, and 90% for her riding. Cathy is a junior member of the USDF Education Faculty, and is on the board of the Region 3 JR/YR program.

"I grew up in South Africa and began riding at age seven. My parents got me a 12 HH Basuto pony who had very little schooling, but taught me to stay on as it was always a long walk back to the barn if I fell off! At that time we lived on a large cattle farm and I ran wild with my pony. The following year I went into the riding school and began a more formal riding education. The riding school was run by Beresford Manning. He had competed in show jumping in Europe and was a wonderful horseman and mentor. My parents were always very supportive and provided me with super ponies and horses. I competed in showing, showjumping and equitation. I qualified for Nationals in equitation twice and both times was in the top 10 junior riders in the country. For fun, I did games, tentpegging and played polocrosse.

At sixteen I started to teach beginners on the lunge line at the riding school and slowly progressed to teaching group lessons. After leaving school I decided on a career in Science and worked in Medical Research after obtaining a Masters in Molecular Genetics. As a young adult I evented to Prelim level and then went on to focus more on dressage. I was lucky to find a wonderful dressage instructor, Anya Glintenkamp, who had been trained by one of the bereiters from the Spanish Riding School. I worked with her for four years and then took a break from riding to have a family.

As soon as my kids were old enough, I started riding again, this time schooling showjumpers at Paul and Lindi Garlicki's facility. I started teaching dressage lessons part time and soon had enough students to give up my science job and focus full time on dressage.

We moved to the US in 1999 and once I obtained my Green card, I started teaching and training full time. I have ridden in clinics with Volker Brommen, George Williams, Lilo Fore, Betsy Steiner, Henk van Bergen, Christoff Hess, Juan Mutate, and Conrad Schumacher. I attend as many clinics and trainer conferences as I can and read extensively."

I have students that are competing at all levels of dressage and some from other disciplines. I focus primarily on rider balance and the correct use of the aids and how that then influences the horse. I am passionate about my teaching and improving the communication between rider and horse.


