

Bolognese are generally healthy, long-lived dogs, and breed history and breeder experience reflect a low incidence of genetic disease. Thanks to a strong genetic foundation and careful breeding, the Bolognese remains a structurally sound and healthy breed. A responsible breeder will screen breeding stock for conditions such as luxating patella and eye disorders.

At this time, the American Bolognese Club, AKC Parent Club, feels that a responsible breeder will screen sire and dam for the following health tests:

- Evaluation of patellas by veterinarian at one year of age or older.
- Annual CAER (Companion Animal Eye Registry)
- PRA/prcd

Regular dental care and grooming are recommended to maintain the breed's oral health, coat, and skin.
