- 1. Career Roadmaps & Growth Strategies
 - **Dr. Manreet Bhullar** shared his journey from India to academia in the U.S.
 - Emphasized the importance of mentorship, goal setting, and a backup plan.
 - Encouraged students to pursue leadership training and seek funding opportunities.
 - **Dr. Manan Sharma** spoke about his transition into government research.
 - Initially focused on meat science, later transitioned to produce safety.
 - Highlighted the broad applicability of food science skills across different sectors.

2. Career Transitions & Job Mobility

- Pranav Vashisht discussed transitioning between roles in the dairy industry.
 - Stressed the importance of team environment, managerial support, and continuous learning.
 - International students should consider immigration support when choosing employers.

3. Networking & Communication

- Dr. Deepti Salvi emphasized active networking and professional branding.
 - Recommended LinkedIn engagement, mentorship programs, and leadership roles in professional organizations.
 - Suggested maintaining connections even during career gaps.
- **Dr. Manan Sharma** reinforced networking as a practical tool, not just a formality.
 - The food safety field is small—building relationships helps long-term career development.

4. Professional Branding & Visibility

- **Pranav Vashisht** highlighted volunteering and leadership roles in professional societies like IAFP, IFT, and ADS.
- **Dr. Manreet Bhullar** stressed the importance of high impact research and sharing achievements via LinkedIn.

5. Work Life Balance

- Dr. Deepti Salvi & Dr. Manreet Bhullar shared strategies:
 - Set realistic goals and prioritize tasks.
 - Use calendars to balance professional and personal commitments.
 - Avoid overcommitting and maintain efficiency in work hours.

AUDIENCE Q&A HIGHLIGHTS

- Academia vs. Industry:
 - Students should explore both through internships and networking before making a decision.
 - Experience in one sector can enhance opportunities in the other.

Postdoc Opportunities for Senior Researchers from India:

- No strict age limit for postdocs in the U.S.
- Funding sources include universities, industry partnerships, and Indian government fellowships.

- USDA & FDA Career Opportunities:
 - Student internships and postdocs are common entry points.
 - Federal jobs require U.S. citizenship or green card status for permanent positions.
- Impact of U.S. Funding & Immigration Policies on Career Prospects:
 - No immediate impact, but long-term funding constraints may arise.
 - Industry and nonprofit funding remain viable alternatives.
