## SI of Fond du Lac, WI



#### Violet Richardson Recipient Creates Empowerment Program

Empowered to Create is the brainchild of SIBN's Lakeesha James-Smith. As a program, Empowered to Create has sponsored numerous events for girls and women since its inception in 2014 when Lakeesha joined Soroptimists. Lakeesha, a 2013 Violet Richardson Award winner was THE LAST Violet Richardson recipient for the Bloomington-Normal Club. In 2014 the Violet Richardson changed to Live Your Dream. Empowered to Create activities have involved support from Bloomington-Normal Soroptimists over the past 6 years.

Recently, the program held a Virtual Baby Shower for new moms from a local social service agency, *Children's Home + Aid*. SIBN members contributed shower donations (e.g., diapers, baby clothes and accessories) which were delivered before their virtual (Zoom) shower. SIBN President Becky Mentzer participated telling her own story of being a teen mom and relating the importance of support and encouragement. She shared the mission of *Soroptimist* and the two signature programs of *Dream It Be It* and *Live Your Dream*.

With Soroptimist support, Empowered to Create sponsored Young Ladies Teas in 2014, 2015, and 2016 preceded by social etiquette and self-care workshops for young girls living in Bloomington-Normal and Peoria. A With My Girls Empowerment Institute held in September 2016 featured the Drug Court Coordinator for Chestnut Health Systems sharing her life goal to educate, nurture and equip youth and single adults to make a difference in their personal, spiritual, and community life.

In 1999 Lakeesha came to Bloomington-Normal and *Illinois State University* as an exchange student from *Southern University* in Baton Rouge LA . . . and she stayed! Majoring in English she eventually took a position at *The Baby Fold*, a local social service organization. She has been in a variety of social service positions and is now the Resident Services Coordinator for the *Bloomington Housing Authority* (BHA). She loves working with a diverse population of older adults and those with disabilities with BHA. *Soroptimists* and members have provided support for a number of her clients. She is currently enrolled in graduate course work part-time. Her empowerment advocacy covers the entire age, ability, and cultural spectrum starting with young girls and more recently to older adults, including those with disabilities.

Bloomington-Normal is blessed to have Lakeesha, her husband Steven and their 3-year old son in the community. A woman for whom Lakeesha has helped over a period of time stated "Lakeesha lives in a holy place. Thank God for her. She is one of God's angels". It is a joy for SIBN to have this "angel" as one of its members!

#### 100s for Soroptimist's 100th Anniversary

Soroptimist International Grosse Pointe (SIGP) is celebrating Soroptimist's **100**th Anniversary every month of 2021 with projects of **100**s. Gleaners Food Pantry was our first endeavor. In January, members were asked to clean out their cupboards of non perishable food items. We hoped to collect **100** items to donate to Gleaners but ended up with a whopping 602 pounds! Gleaners distributes food in Detroit where the poverty rate is over 30% and over 50% of households are headed by women. We were pleased that we were able to help women and their children in a small but significant way.

**100** Acts of Kindness in the month of February saw members greeting strangers with smiles, picking up litter on their daily walks, reconnecting with old friends, and leaving small anonymous gifts for neighbors. Kindness also included feeding the birds, writing a check to a charity, delivering donuts to police and fire stations, and equally important, taking time to appreciate the richness of one's life.

March was a very busy month! The club project was to collect **100** pairs of reading glasses to give to women in a recovery program. Without clear vision, these women cannot read a book, follow a recipe, thread a needle, or see their phone messages. Members were generous in their contributions and many fashionable reading glasses were donated.

A group of local women heard about SIGP and our **100**s projects. They wanted to contribute their talent to a worthwhile organization so they sewed over 200 masks and asked us to donate them to a charity of our choosing. A group that works with the homeless and families living on the edge was grateful to receive the masks and distributed them in their outreach mission to help prevent the spread of Covid-19.

Our Awards ceremony was held in March via Zoom. **100** kudos were given to our awards winners and **100** additionial to Briana Cruga, who not only won our Virginia Wagner Award but is the District III and Midwestern Region winner!

Our own member, Dolores Goodger, turns **100** on April 11th. What an achievement in our **100**th year! **100** birthday greetings will be sent to her by our club members, friends and other Soroptimist clubs during the month of April. Stay tuned for more **100**s to come!

The committee of volunteers decided to have the drawing just prior to Valentine's Day and give meaning to "For the Love of Wine" title.

Our membership and others made donations to launch the fundraiser and we filled two baskets with quality wines and accessories for a drawing held on February 10, as part of our Business Meeting via Zoom.

McCourt. She won a basket filled with 12 bottles of fine wine along with accessories: a wine table runner (made and quilted by SIGP member Mary Ellen Burke), wine opener, aerator, wine saver, four Lenox crystal wine glasses, cloth cocktail napkins and chocolates.

The second-place winner was Jen Rau, a friend of SIGP member Carrie Petrocelli. She won four bottles of fine wine, cloth cocktail napkins, two crystal stemless wine glasses, a wine saver, and chocolates.

Raffle tickets were distributed to each member to sell to friends, neighbors, and family, or to purchase for themselves. Ticket sales were not required, yet the results were quite encouraging and made this a successful fundraiser during a pandemic with no in-person meetings!

We ordered 2,000 tickets to be printed and packaged in books of six for \$20, and individual tickets were \$5. We sold 87% of our tickets. Most of our members participated to some degree, and our fundraiser raised more than \$5800 after expenses!

A full report will be submitted to the SIGP Board with all the data. A meeting of the committee will be scheduled to discuss the success and next steps, if any, about this fundraiser.

I am so grateful for your support to help restore hope and empower women who have been exploited. THANK YOU!



The **Live Your Dream Award** provides women who serve as the primary wage earners for their families with a financial award to offset costs associated with attaining higher education.

Ms. Montgomery, the first place winner receives \$1,000 and is studying nursing at Central Ohio Technical College (COTC). Ms. Collins, the second place winner receives \$500 and is studying Human Services at COTC. Both were appreciative of the Awards.

"The Soroptimist club has been a giant blessing in my life, helping relieve the stress of financial strain school can put on a single mom," Montgomery said. "I'm so thankful for the award and am excited to further my education."

"The Live Your Dream Award was created for non-traditional students - women who have overcome some struggles in their lives, and are now raising their families while also going to school to make their lives better. Mikala and Meredith were impressive applicants, and we are happy to give them these awards," explained Becky Chamberlin, Chair. The **Live Your Dream Awards** have disbursed almost \$35 million in awards to tens of thousands of women since the Award winning program began in 1972.

She wants to make a difference in the lives of so many others. Elizabeth is pursuing a professional certificate in Medical Coding and hopes to be a good role model for her son. As a widow with young children, she needed to make many sacrifices on behalf of her family. She wants her son to know that hard work does have its reward and you can achieve your dreams. We were fortunate to have the award winners on the video link so that they could say hello. We are so very honored to support such courageous and dedicated women. SI Kenton/Hardin County presented Mia Benitez the Judy Farrington Memorial Award/Violet Richardson Award. Mia is a high school student who dedicates a tremendous amount of time to her community. Mia's charity is One Simple Wish™ who empowers us to restore hope and happiness to children and young adults who have been impacted by foster care, abuse, and neglect. What a wonderful young lady! Kennedy Cook an Ohio Northern University political science student won the Virginia Wagner Award. Kennedy was selected to be the primary assistant to the newly formed "Institute for Civics and Public Policy' and is currently preparing to study abroad in Hungary. Taylor Ellerbrock was the award winner for the Judy MaGaw Award, which honors SI Kenton/Hardin County's past president. Taylor is a Medical Laboratory Science and Biology major at Ohio Northern University who has been named an Academic All-OAC athlete for track and cross country.
