



1ST PROVINCIAL TEAM VISIT TO TEMPLECOMBE NO.686

The Templecombe Preceptory meeting held on 13th March saw the Eminent Preceptor E.Kt. Martyn Russell warmly welcome R.E.Kt. Paul Davis the Provincial Prior for Somerset, the Provincial Sub-Prior and thirteen accompanying Provincial Officers on a formal Provincial Team Visit. A meeting at which were 30 + Knights were in attendance.

After the appropriate salutations had been given, a delegation of Knights from the King Ina Preceptory No.211 arrived bearing the Somerset Sword of Chivalry for presentation on its journey around the Province. The delegation was warmly welcomed and E.Kt. Mike Caswell PrSwdB, presented the Sword to the Eminent Preceptor of Templecombe Preceptory for safe keeping and charged him to deliver it to the Worlebury Preceptory of St Dunstan No.121 at their next regular meeting in May.

There then followed the Installation of a new Knight, Kt. Alex Shorey. The Eminent Preceptor conducted the ceremony in an excellent manner assisted throughout by his Officers with the accolade being conferred by R.E.Kt Paul Davis, the Provincial Prior of Somerset using the Somerset Sword of Chivalry.

In addition, the Preceptory also welcomed two Joining members V.E.Kt. A.T. Jones P.Gt.Reg and E.Kt. R.H. Moore P.Gt.Chamb.











SOMERSET SWORD OF CHIVALRY ARRIVES AT WORLEBURY

May 1st saw the arrival of the Somerset Sword of Chivalry at Worlebury Preceptory of St Dunstan No.121.

A delegation of 11 Knights from Templecombe Preceptory No.686 was led by their EP E.Kt. Martyn Russell who presented the Sword to E.Kt. Terry Porter the Eminent Preceptor of Worlebury in a commendable manner and charged him to deliver the Sword to the Provincial Prior for Somerset at the next Provincial Priory Meeting on Monday, 8th September. The Provincial Prior would then direct him to where the Sword should travel too next.


This particular meeting of Worlebury Preceptory was a busy meeting with ballots and elections taking place. In addition, a new Knight was installed Kt. Steve Tedd. The Eminent Preceptor conducted the ceremony in an

exemplary manner assisted by his Officers. The accolade being conferred by the Provincial Vice-Chancellor who was representing the Provincial Prior that evening. In addition, he was asked to present both Templar & Malta Patents to recently installed Knights.

It was sad to hear that evening that E.Kt. John Elmont P.Gt.Her (a member of both Worlebury and Templecombe Preceptorys) had returned home from hospital a short while beforehand and was unable to be present at this particular meeting. Especially as it was precisely 40 years earlier, on this same meeting in May 1985 that John was installed as a Knight Templar.

He will in due course be presented with a Certificate by the Provincial Prior to commemorate magnificent achievement in a progressive degree.



SOMERSET MASONIC YEARBOOK - A SYNOPSIS OF OUR ORDER AS REPLICATED THEREIN

The full title of this Order is The United Religious, Military and Masonic Orders of the Temple and of St John of Jerusalem, Palestine, Rhodes and Malta in England and Wales and its Provinces Overseas. It is one of the most principled and truly prestigious Christian Orders in Freemasonry, administered by its Great Priory at Mark Masons Hall in London. It comprises of three Degrees.

The Knight Templar degree commemorates the Chivalric Order of Knights Templar founded by nine Crusaders in the year 1118 and firmly recognizes its precepts and humble origins. A candidate for membership as a Masonic Knight Templar is therefore expected to be a mature and experienced Freemason, having been raised to a Master Mason and exalted into Royal Arch Chapter and profess the Trinitarian faith.

The ceremony of Installation of a Knight Templar involves arriving as a pilgrim and concludes by receiving Knighthood. After having hailed as a Knight of the Order of the Temple and experienced the camaraderie that exists amongst its member Knights, the novice will later undertake a short 'passing degree' as a Knight of St. Paul which will lead him to being Installed as a Knight of Malta. This supplementary degree traces the history of the Knights throughout the Mediterranean over a period of some four-hundred years after they were compelled to leave Palestine.

Whilst the ceremonies recall the history and activities of these ancient Orders with military discipline and conduct, they are a sincere and moving masonic ritual and although the regalia worn by Masonic Knights is impressive and is based on the costume of their medieval counterparts, there is no proven link between these two groups.

Overall, the Masonic Order of Knight Templar encourages a commitment to an enjoyable, rewarding and colourful dimension of Freemasonry in its broadest sense; inspiring its members to approach life in a way which does good for others, enriched by lasting bonds of friendship and esprit de corps.

In this Order all meetings and regular business are conducted in Preceptories of which there are twelve. These are listed in the following pages.










SOMERSET SWORD OF CHIVALRY

He should be your first port of call when looking for Regalia, and perhaps regalia for other Orders too.


There is a plethora of second-hand regalia of reasonable quality available, and he is finding his feet around the myriads of outlets if it is your preference for new.

Meetings are held monthly at MMH and Life Membership for a Knight is only £2 per annum.


Therefore, all Knights of the Order are cordially invited to attend. Regalia is not required & swords and belts are provided at MMH.

LEST WE FORGET

E.Kt. William Robert John Knight PPr2ndCon a member of King Arthur of Avalon Preceptory No.551. He was Installed as a Knight of our Order in King Ina Preceptory No.211 at the February meeting in 1982 and resigned in 1999. During that period in 1989he became a Founder member of King Arthur of Avalon Preceptory No.551, attaining Eminent Preceptor in 1991, and Provincial honours of PPrStB(B) in 1991; PPrReg in 1996; and PPr2ndCon in 2000. Finally, he received the command of the Great Captain on 9th March this year.



- Bro.Kt. Simon John Horne a member of King Arthur of Avalon Preceptory No.551 and Our Lady of Walsingham. He was installed as a Knight of our Order on 6/3/2013 and soon became a prominent member of the Provincial Prior's Bodyguard and joined the Bodyguard Preceptory in 2015.
 - In King Arthur he attained the Office of 1st Constable but never reached the position Eminent Preceptor due to the onset of a very serious illness which left him severely debilitated. During that time he was appointed Provincial Guard for two consecutive years 2020-2022 and received Honorary membership of King Arthur Preceptory in2022. Lastly, receiving the command of the Great Captain on 7th April this year.
- † Bro.Kt. John Michael O'Neill a member of Estune Command Preceptory No.354. He was Installed as a Knight of our Order on 22/05/2003 but resigned on 31/03/2008. Some nine years later in 2017 he re-joined the Preceptory and afterwards held the position of 1st Herald for 4 years; and finally received the command of the Great Captain on 13th April this year.
