



# I-5 (Golden State Freeway) Roadway Rehabilitation Project

## Northern Los Angeles County – Santa Clarita Valley

*“Improving your drive on I-5”*

### Project Overview

This is a Caltrans roadway rehabilitation project on Interstate 5 (the Golden State Freeway) in and near the city of Santa Clarita. The project will construct new concrete pavement and produce a smoother ride for travelers on I-5.

The work will be done on 15.8 miles of I-5, including northbound and southbound lanes, from 0.5 miles south of State Route 14 (the Antelope Valley Freeway) to 1.7 miles north of Lake Hughes Road.

This segment of I-5 has pavement that is more than 50 years old and no longer adequate for the existing and future traffic loads. The project will extend the service life of the roadway and upgrade parts of the highway that are failing, worn out or functionally obsolete.

### Project Benefits

Pavement quality is essential for motorists to travel safely and comfortably, and for the economy and jobs. California’s highways carry 40 percent of the nation’s imports. I-5 is a backbone of the state highway system and an essential route in Los Angeles County and the Santa Clarita Valley.

This project will reduce the need for future lane closures for maintenance and construction, which means drivers will experience fewer delays in the future.

- Cost: \$171 million
