ORDERED: December 2, 2024

At the request of the Commissioner of Public Buildings, and with the approval of his Honor the Mayor, the City Council hereby appropriates the sum of two hundred forty-five thousand two hundred and ninety seven and 36/100 (\$245,297.36) dollars for the purpose of purchasing the land located at 1072 Sea Street known as Lots 57 and 59 on Assessors' Plan No. 1058, containing 19,919 square feet of land, more or less, all as more particularly described in a deed recorded at Norfolk Deeds in Book 31160, Page 440; said land to be acquired for purposes of the expansion of the Houghs Neck Firehouse and related infrastructure, together with the dedication of a portion of said lot to Open Space.

At the request of the Commissioner of Public Buildings, and with the approval of his Honor the Mayor, the City Council hereby appropriates the sum of one million one hundred thousand and 00/100 (\$1,100,000.00) dollars for the purpose of purchasing the land located at 47-57 Lincoln Ave., aka 48 Winthrop Ave, shown on Assessors' Plan No. 5185 as MBLU 5185/16/1, containing 23,843 square feet of land, more or less, improved by a 14,064 square foot structure. This property is to be acquired for purposes of preservation of a parcel listed on the National Register of Historic Places, and to ensure the continuance of programs and uses now benefiting the community.
