Volunteer Visa Guide - South Africa

For UK & EU Residents — Step-by-Step Guide to Applying for a Volunteer Visa (Visitor Visa with Volunteer Endorsement or Temporary Residence Volunteer Visa).

1 Visa Options

- Visitor Visa with Volunteer Endorsement (Section 11(1)(b)(ii)) valid up to 90 days, extendable in South Africa.
- Temporary Residence Visa Volunteer Visa (Section 11(6)) required for stays longer than 90 days, issued for up to 3 years.

2 Required Documents

- Valid Passport (30+ days after departure, 2 blank pages).
- Completed Application Form (DHA-1738).
- Letter from South African Host Organisation confirming volunteer role, duration, and accommodation.
- Proof of Financial Means (bank statements/sponsor letter).
- Medical & Radiological Reports (if stay exceeds 90 days).
- Police Clearance Certificate (if stay exceeds 6 months).
- Proof of Travel & Medical Insurance covering the stay.
- Flight Itinerary (return or onward ticket).
- Visa Fee (£50 £70 UK, varies by EU country).

3 Application Process

- Apply at the South African High Commission (London) or South African Embassy/Consulate in your EU country.
- Submit all required supporting documents.
- Processing time: 4 8 weeks (longer for Temporary Residence visas).
- On arrival in South Africa, visa will be stamped in passport.

4 Important Notes

- This visa does NOT allow paid work only volunteering.
- Apply for extensions at VFS Global offices in South Africa at least 60 days before expiry.
- Overstaying can result in being declared 'undesirable' and banned from re-entry.
- Participants must carry their visa and passport at all times while in South Africa.
