ABOUT: The International Music Competition - Rhythm for Goods is co-organized by the UNITAR Prosperity Alliance Singapore (PASG) and Brotherhood Cup Foundation. The competition aims to empower young musicians by using music as a tool for cultural exchange, leadership development, and community impact. The competition provides a global platform for talented youth to showcase their artistic abilities while encouraging them to contribute to society through community service and sustainable development initiatives.

ELIGIBILITY: Open to all ages 30 years old and younger worldwide. Winners of the competition must be passionate about piano, western string and wind instruments, with a strong desire to perform on the international stage. Additionally, winners should be enthusiastic about representing their country in cultural exchange and demonstrate a sense of social responsibility and strong moral character.

AGE GROUPS FOR ALL AWARDS DIVISIONS:

The competition features two categories: Amateur and Young Artist. The Amateur category is divided into age groups, with eligibility determined by the contestant's age as of June 1, 2025. Participants aged 16 to 18 may compete either in the 16-18 age group within the Amateur category or in the Young Artist category, which is open to contestants aged 16 and older.

Application Process and Competition Timeline

1. Global Launch (June 2025)

The official global announcement of the competition will take place in June 2025, marking the beginning of the registration period. Online registration will be open to contestants from all participating countries, allowing young musicians worldwide to take part in this prestigious event.

2. Preliminary and semi final Round (June,6 2025 - DEC 31, 2025)

During the preliminary round, all contestants must complete their registration through the designated application portal of their respective regions.

- Screening will be conducted based on age group, ensuring fair competition across different levels.
- Participants will be required to submit initial recordings showcasing their musical talent and artistic interpretation.
- Judges will assess key factors such as technical proficiency, musical expression, and performance quality.
- Video need to taken by 2025

3. list of finals will be announced at Jan 2026

Contestants who successfully pass the preliminary screening will advance to the semi-finals, where they must submit a new performance video for evaluation.

- Video submissions must feature different pieces from the preliminary round, demonstrating versatility and artistic growth.
- Judges will conduct a comprehensive review, assessing creativity, technical execution, and musical interpretation.
- Selected semi-finalists will receive feedback from industry professionals, helping them refine their craft for the final stage

4. Final Round: Live performance in Singapore (February 2026)

Finalists will take center stage in a live competition held in Singapore, where they will perform before a distinguished panel of renowned musicians, educators, and industry experts.

- All finalists must submit a personal resume and life achievement statement, including:
 - Documentary photo evidence supporting their listed accomplishments and credentials.
 - Two artistic profile photos and two candid/lifestyle photos to highlight their personality and stage presence.
- The evaluation criteria will not only focus on musical talent but also consider the contestants' contributions to community service and sustainable development.
- Finalists will also have the opportunity to attend masterclass lectures, gaining valuable mentorship from international music experts.

Evaluation Criteria

Evaluation will be conducted based on three key criteria:

1. Musical Expression & Artistic Appeal

- Interpretation & Emotion: Ability to convey depth, originality, and emotional connection in performance.
- Stage Presence: Confidence, engagement with the audience, and overall artistic impression.
- Creativity & Musicality: Unique artistic interpretation and stylistic expression.

2. Technical Performance

- Accuracy & Technique: Precision in pitch, rhythm, and overall execution.
- Complexity & Skill: Ability to perform challenging pieces with mastery.
- Tonal Quality & Control: Strength, clarity, and control of sound production.

3. Multidimensional Development (Based on Personal Resume)

- Achievements & Awards: Past recognition in music and arts.
- Education & Training: Formal music education, mentorship, or self-directed learning.

- Community Contribution & Social Impact: Participation in music-related outreach, charitable performances, and commitment to social causes.

Final Round Rules and Regulations

Finalist of the competition will need to follow these performance requirements. Any violation of the following rules will result in no scoring:

- Full Performance Required – Contestants must perform the entire piece in full, including all cadenzas, with NO repeats allowed.
- No Excerpts or Simplified Versions – Selections must be performed as originally composed; judges reserve the right to request specific sections and determine performance duration.
- Memorization is Mandatory – All performances must be memorized unless performing Classical Chamber music or Piano Duet.
