Zoning report:

Chad Patton gave the zoning report for March. There were 3 permits for the month. A motion was made by Mr. Ames to accept the zoning report. The motion was seconded by Mr. Walsh and the motion passed.

Road Report

Mr. Walsh read a summary of the road work done in March which included: shop work, PM on equipment, potholes filled, Orchard Drive project, ditches on Freeman Road cleaned, and the beaver issue was addressed several times.
