

**September 12, 2023

The Board of Supervisors of Overfield Township, Wyoming County, Pa., met at 7:00 P.M. at the Overfield Township Municipal Building for their ninth regular meeting for the fiscal year 2023.

Those present were; Chairman-Donald Ames; Supervisor- John Manglaviti; Roadmaster- John Walsh; Sec. / Treas. - Susan Smith; Police Chief Ed Morrstell and 5 signed in residents.

The minutes of the regular meeting of August 8, 2023 were not read but copies were e-mailed to all supervisors prior to the meeting. Mr. Walsh made a motion that the minutes be accepted as written. Mr. Manglaviti seconded the motion. All in favor. So carried

A motion was made by Mr. Ames to accept the Treasurer's report. Mr. Walsh seconded the motion. All in favor. So carried.

The bills were presented for review and discussion. A motion was made by Mr. Manglaviti that the bills be paid. This motion was seconded by Mr. Walsh. All in favor. So carried.

Solicitor's report: None

Planning Commission report:

Susan Smith read the Planning Commission's minutes from their August meeting. Mr. Walsh made a motion to accept the August minutes. Mr. Ames seconded the motion. All in favor. So carried.

Zoning report:

Susan Smith gave the zoning report for August. There were 7 permits for the month. Chad asked that the Supervisors would be informed that the zoning changes are being reviewed by the Planning Commission and Paul Litwin and will then go to the Supervisors for review and a meeting date established. A motion was made by Mr. Ames to accept the zoning report. The motion was seconded by Mr. Manglaviti. All in favor. So carried.

Road Report:

Mr. Walsh gave a summary of the road work done in August: brush mowing, truck maintenance, graded Fox Road in cooperation with Lemon and Tunkhannock Townships, assisted Lemon Township for two days, gradall on Ross Road, Freeman Road and Camp Spear Road, 2 pipes put in on Camp Spear Road, clean up after storms, started regrading Camp Spear Road, rebuilt the plow, and miscellaneous maintenance on equipment A motion was made by Mr. Ames to accept the report. Mr. Manglaviti seconded the motion. All in favor. So carried.

Police Report

Chief Morrstell gave the report for August: There were 46 incidents: 6 traffic citations, 2 traffic warnings, and 1 criminal arrest with 2 charges. A motion was made by Mr. Manglaviti and seconded by Mr. Walsh to accept the report. All in favor. Motion carried.

Paula Schloder gave the report : There is a lot coming up. On October 21st there will be a fundraiser for Halloween at the park to include Fire Company Touch a truck, food vendors, a haunted trail, a day trail for the younger kids and much more. Terri Lenhart said that it was all cleared with the Fish Commission. There are bids out for a pickleball court. There will be a petting zoo, face painting and tattoos at the fundraiser. There was discussion about needing a new chain by the carousel pad. A motion was made by Mr. Ames to accept the report. Mr. Manglaviti seconded the motion. All in favor. So carried.

Correspondence

Unfinished Business

-Retirement-Mr. Ames gave a brief summary of what the charge to the township for 3 employees and wants to take more time for all of the supervisors to read it and ask any questions. Retirement is tabled until the October meeting.

New Business

-Brody to be hired for coop program at Tunkhannock High School- A motion was made by Mr. Manglaviti and seconded by Mr. Walsh to hire Brody Gregory for the coop program. All in favor. So Carried.

- Mr. Ames stated that due to the storm the Overfield Township declared a State of Emergency on Monday 11th of September.

-Certified mail regarding the Falls Quarry-no action taken.

With no further business brought before the Board, Mr. Walsh made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Manglaviti seconded the motion. All in favor. So carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:34
