

KOURELLION GREEK SCHOOL, MARGATE



My name is Iacovos and I am one of the pupils at the Greek school of Margate. What follows is my personal but also the general review from all the children at the Margate Greek school.

Our Greek school provides safety, warmth and active learning to all the children that go there, giving as much attention as the teacher can to each one. It also provides equipment such as pencils, pens, markers, colouring pencils, rulers, rubbers and much more, including exercise books.

I have come over from Cyprus, where we had lots of teachers, students and classrooms, but although the Greek school here is much smaller, with fewer students, one teacher, and one room, it lets the teacher have individual one to one tuition, and to clearly and thoroughly explain the tasks and topics to all children, so they all get a clear understanding in every topic we do.

In our Greek school, all the children are friends; this differs from my school in Cyprus because that had occasional bullying, something that never happens here. Older pupils, like myself, get the satisfaction of helping each other, and to help younger students while our teacher is explaining something to a group of other children. We have a very good and qualified teacher that knows how to clearly explain and plan a lesson, having everyone work hard but with occasional breaks if they get tired or need a drink.

The Greek school here provides lessons for each age group from primary school all the way up to GCSE and A' level. It does nearly the same subjects that I was doing in my Greek school in Cyprus, but all the ages of pupils are in the same room doing different things. There are also computers that we get to do research on, and provide a calmer, yet, just as efficient way to revise or do online tasks and quizzes.

I can't wait to do my A levels and do well in my education in Greek.
