Turtles have amazing hard shells to protect them. They carry their house on their backs - how cool is that!



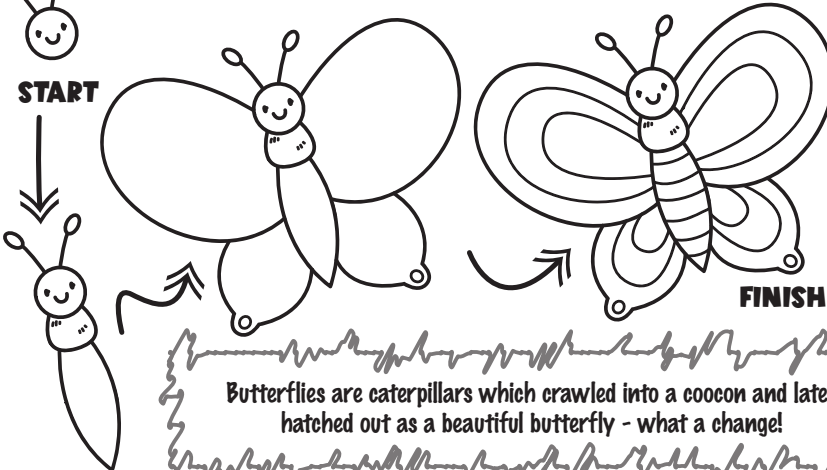

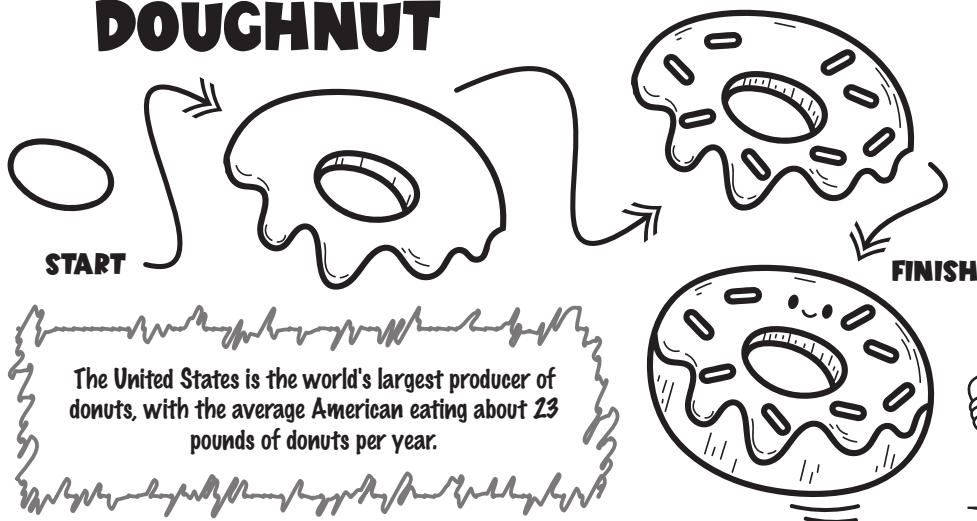
