

Mexican Beautyberry

Callicarpa mexicana



Mexican beautyberry could be called our native beautyberry on steroids. Starting in the fall and going all winter long, it produces hundreds of clusters of burgundy-wine colored berries that are so numerous, your birds will be feasting until spring. **This is THE most prolific fruit producing beautyberry that we grow.**

Grows in sun, part sun and dappled shade – can reach 6'-8' tall or more, depending on how hard you prune it back in the spring. We prefer to let it ramble and grow big as it will also provide shelter for the birds.

Deciduous, although in mild winters it can stay evergreen. The pink flower clusters that precede the berries are nectar rich & great for bees and butterflies.
