Salvia pratensis is a clump-forming salvia that features numerous, dense, upright, spike-like racemes of tiny, two-lipped, flowers which rise above ovate light green basal leaves (to 6" long"). It forms an attractive foliage mound which has been evergreen in our gardens here at Treesearch Farms. Blooms start in early summer & will continue until frost if dead headed regularly. As it is an excellent cut flower, dead heading is not a big deal! The foliage of this mint family member is slightly aromatic when crushed. Attractive to bees and butterflies. We have trialed the above pictured varieties in our Treesearch gardens & have been extremely happy with their performance! Foliage stays 10", flower stalks rise 24"-30". Sun, part sun.
