

Kathy's Kandy Verbena

Verbena canadensis



Kathy's Kandy is a unique selection of native Rose Verbena. It was named by its discoverer Kathy Andrews of Jackson, TN. She found it growing wild in her pasture in Carroll County. It is a tough butterfly-attracting perennial that produces an abundance of pink flowers. Kathy's Kandy blooms for a longer period than the species and has a noticeable sweet fragrance. This selection's leaves seem a bit smaller and darker than the native species. It tolerates a fair amount of drought and isn't that picky as to soil type. It has been **evergreen** through some very hard freezes in Houston. A great groundcover spreading easily 1' to 2' and stays about 10" high. A winner!
