WINECUP

Callirhoe involucrata



A <u>native perennial with evergreen rosettes</u> in winter and long prostrate stems covered with 2" poppy-like <u>fuschia flowers</u> March through April. If you grow them in partial shade and provide regular watering, they will stay green and bloom sporadically through the summer. If you plant them in full sun and tend to be a lazy gardener, they may go dormant in July and return again when the weather is cooler. Winecup looks magnificent cascading over a wall or down a rocky slope. Bees and butterflies love their pollen.
