

Spotted Joe-Pye Weed

Eutrochium maculatum



This perennial gets 3'-5' tall, unbranched except for flowerhead-bearing stalks near the apex of the plant. The central stem can be either solid purple or spotted. Mauve blooms occur from mid to late summer, lasting 3 to 4 weeks – fragrant and very attractive to pollinators like butterflies, bees and moths. Joe-Pye often forms small colonies. Full to partial sun, wet to moist soils – tolerant of water logged conditions. Recently, species of Joe-Pye have been separated from the Bonesets (*Eupatorium* spp.) and re-assigned to the genus *Eutrochium*.
