

St. Joseph's Lily

Hippeastrum x johnsonii



The first hybrid amaryllis that was ever produced sometime around 1790; and, one of the finest amaryllis for garden culture. Being an old heirloom, it's not readily available in the trade. This hardy spring bloomer produces many stalks of fragrant bright red funnel shaped flowers with a white stripe on the inside. Dark green foliage will fade away in the fall, reliably returning each spring. Sets little or no seed. Much more tolerant of heavy clay soils and cold weather than other amaryllis. This is a tough, beautiful bulb for Houston without equal!!
