Heirloom White Cemetery Iris

Iris albicans





This is Texas' most prevalent heirloom iris – a tough survivor – a species cross that is unable to make seeds on its own, but spreads by being passed from hand to hand. Often seen blooming in vacant lots, pastures, roadsides and graveyards. An excellent choice for dry slopes or xeric landscape settings. Blooms in April. Not an iris that would grow in wet ditches or ponds. It does not need coddling with extra water or fertilizer once established.
