SIMPSON'S MYRTLE

Myrcianthes fragrans v. Simpsonii



This is one tough **evergreen!** Hardy to 20 degrees or less, it can be used as a hedge, screen or pruned

up into a small & unique ornamental tree. Fragrant white flowers in spring are followed by an abundance of multi colored berries which birds enjoy. The leaves are aromatic as well. Sun to partial shade. Grows 15' to 20' high, but is easily pruned lower to keep as a hedge. Native to Florida. A great, undiscovered evergreen!! Beautiful, exfoliating bark is another plus!
