Sun or light shade

An extraordinary accent plant for the landscape!
This unique succulent has mostly leafless, lime green stems that stand straight up when planted in sun & arched & wavy when planted in shade. It forms a clump of stems about 3'-4' tall by 3' wide & produces unusual orange-red slipper-shaped (or dragon-head) flowers along the stems in spring & fall. It's extremely drought tolerant & needs good drainage.
